

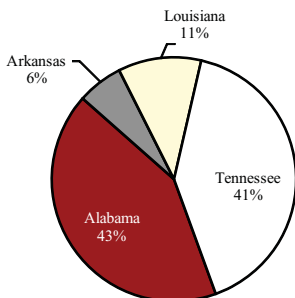

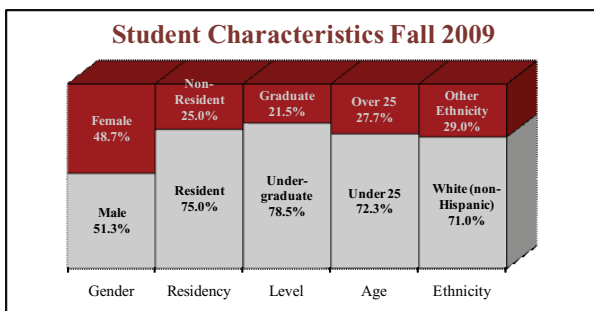

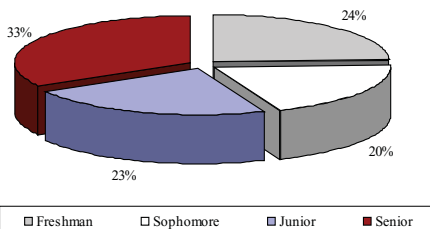

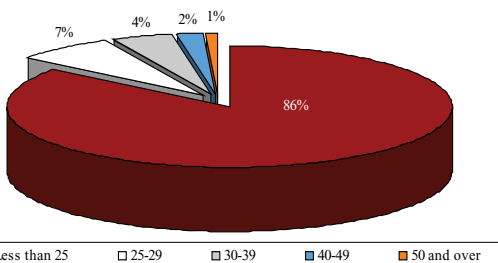
**Fall 2009 Undergraduate Class Distribution**

**Fall 2009 Undergraduate Age Distribution**

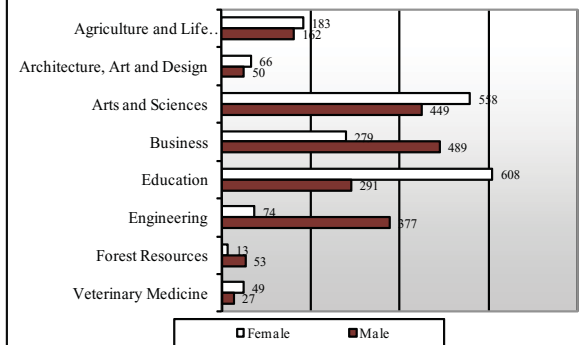

### Degrees Awarded by Gender Fall 2008/2009



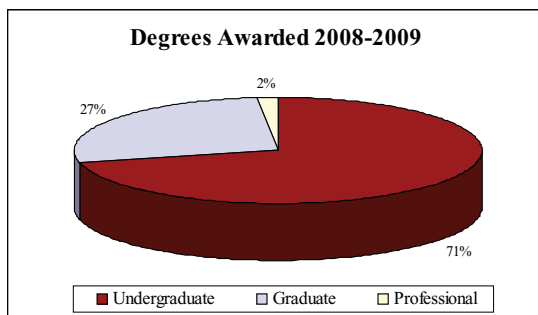

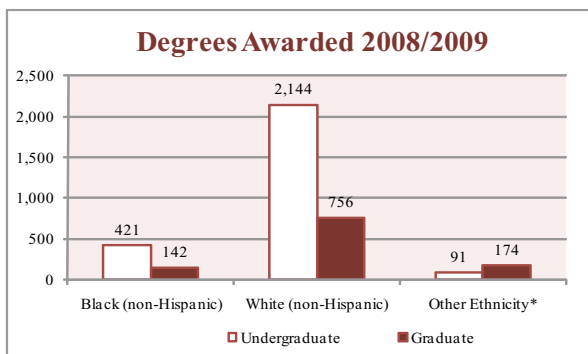

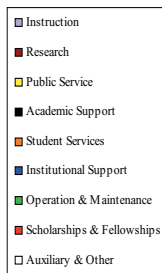
