Adjacent States Enrollment Fall 2012



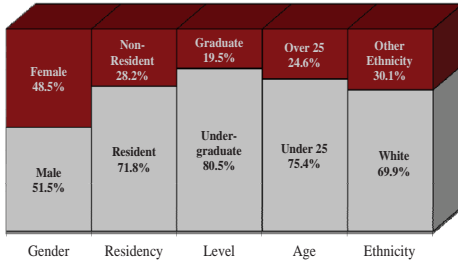

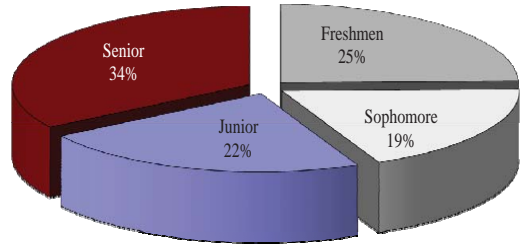

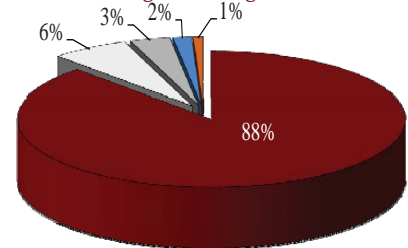
Fall 2012 Undergraduate Class Distribution

Fall 2012 Undergraduate Age Distribution

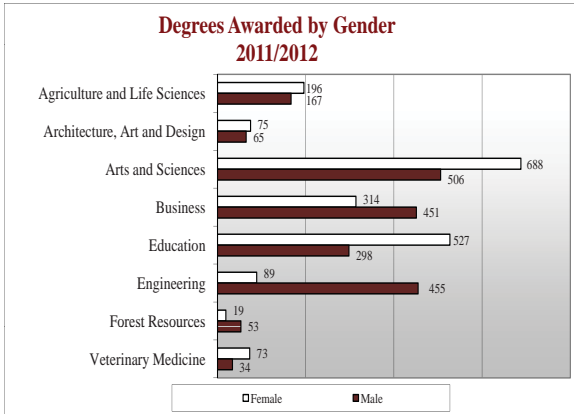

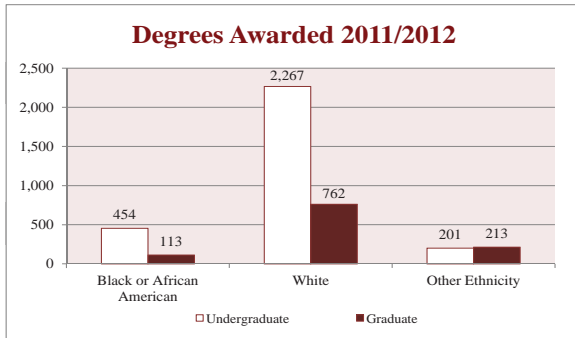

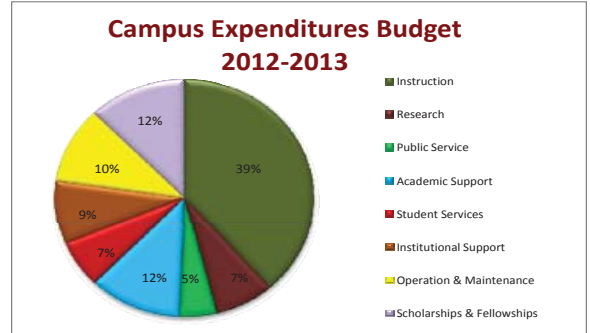
