Adjacent States Enrollment Fall 2015



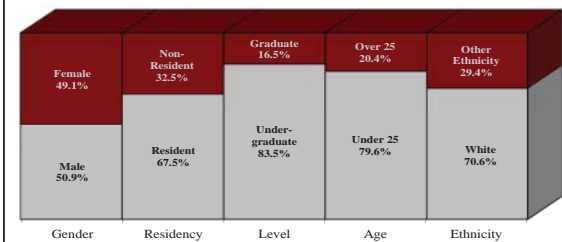

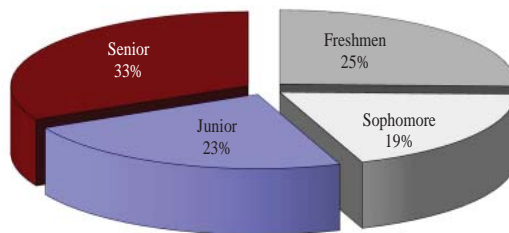

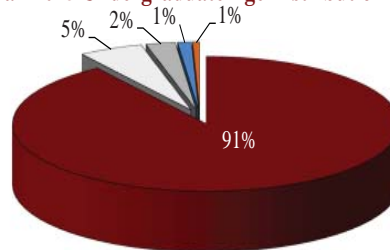
Fall 2015 Undergraduate Class Distribution

Fall 2015 Undergraduate Age Distribution

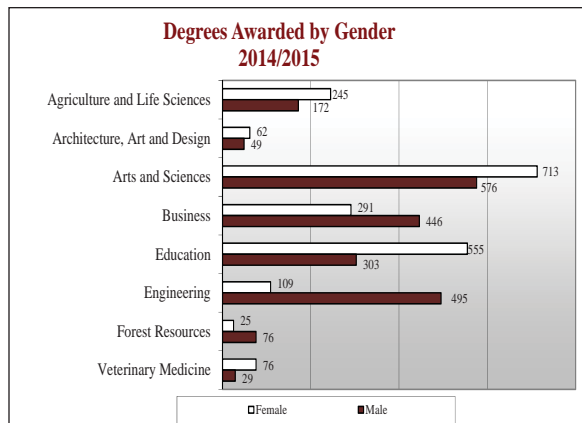

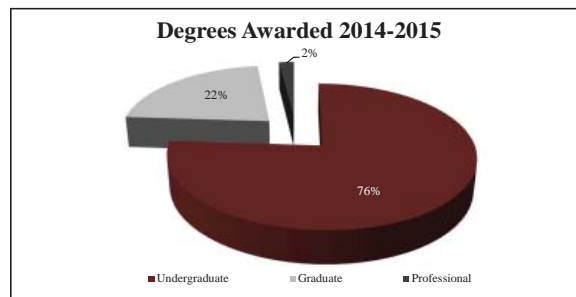

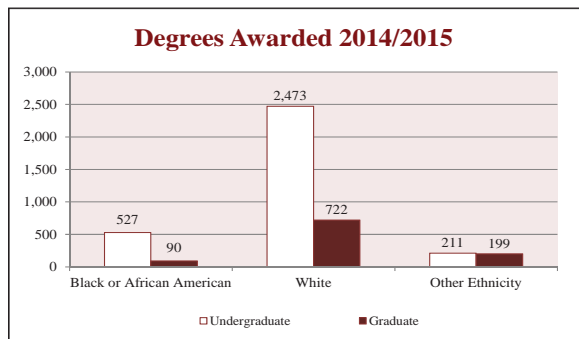

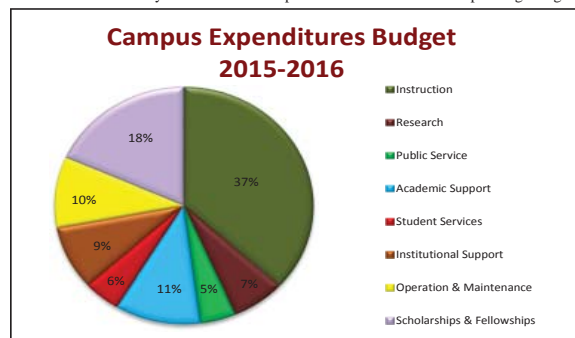
