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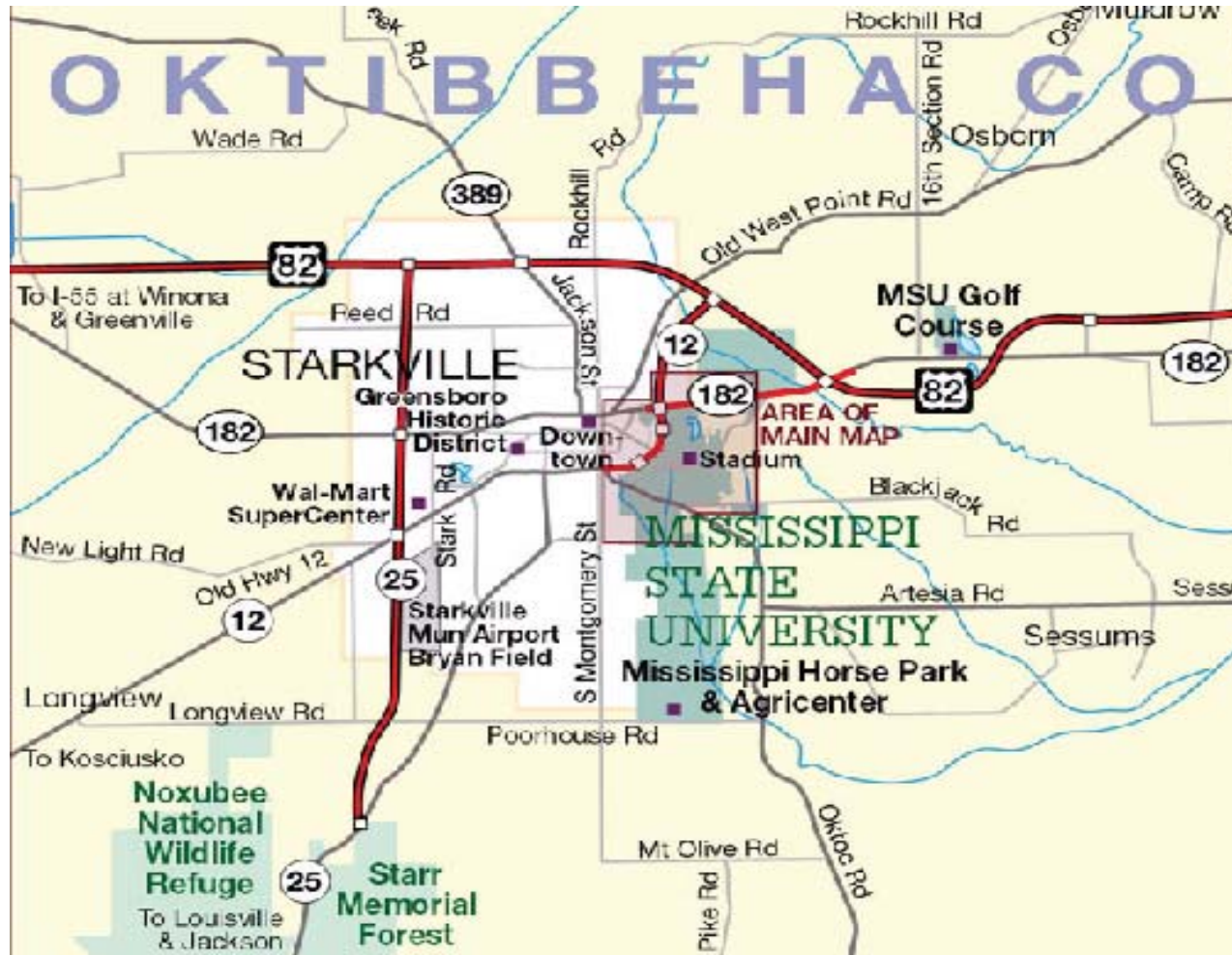
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LOCAL MAP - SURROUNDING AREA

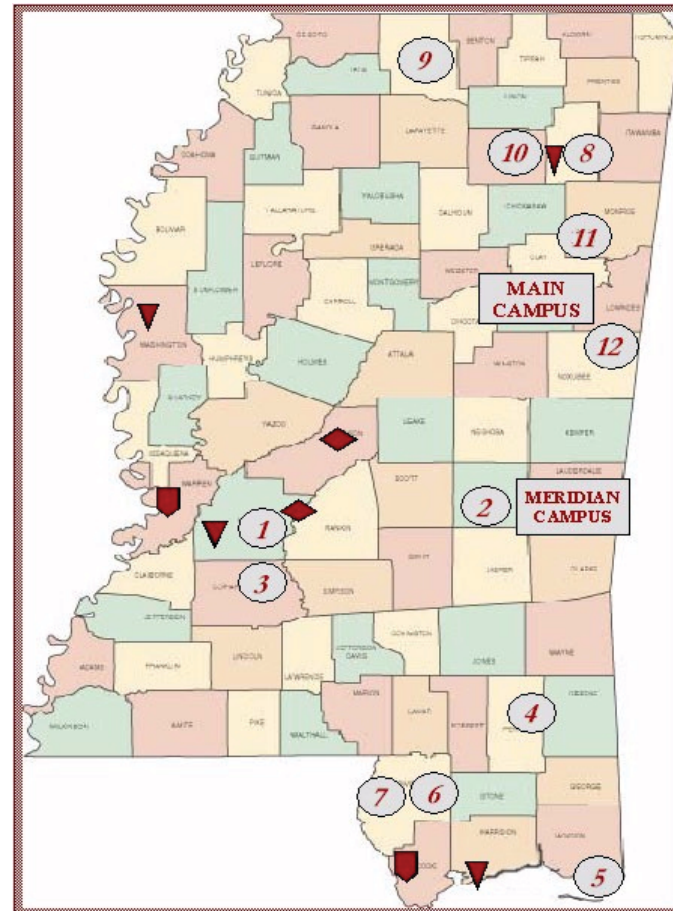

INTRODUCTION

MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY

Established in 1878 and located in Starkville, Mississippi State is a Land-Grant university featuring the state's only Veterinary Medicine School and Architecture program. The university is a Carnegie Doctoral Research Extensive institution. MSU is classified as a Four-Year 2 SREB institution offering approximately 174 programs leading to baccalaureate, master's and specialist, first-professional and doctorate degrees. The vision of Mississippi State University is to be an accessible, responsive, and inclusive land-grant university that is engaged with the many constituencies it serves in delivering excellent programs of teaching, research, and outreach that improve the lives and opportunities of the citizens of the state, region, and world.

MISSION

Mississippi State University is a public, land-grant, doctoral, research university classified as Doctoral/Research-Extensive by the Carnegie Foundation. Its mission is to provide access and opportunity to students from all sectors of the state's diverse population and to offer excellent and extensive programs in instruction, research, and outreach. Enhancing its historic strengths in agriculture, natural resources, science, and engineering, Mississippi State entered the twenty-first century with additional strengths in a comprehensive range of graduate and undergraduate programs. MSU EXTENSION SERVICE/MAFES

MSU Extension Service and Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station (MAFES)

The Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station (MAFES) was established through passage of the Hatch Act of 1887 and subsequent state legislation enacted in 1888 for the expressed purpose of conducting scientific research in agriculture, forestry and related sciences. Thus, funds supporting this research program derive from both federal and state appropriations with the federal funds administered through the USDA, Cooperative State Research Service (CSRS).

Most prominent methods used to deliver Extension educational programs:

- Short Courses, Conferences, and Training Sessions
- Demonstrations and Tours
- Distance Learning Strategies
- Online Information Access
- Traditional Media

Extension's educational programs can be grouped into four categories:

- certification and legislatively mandated programs;
- workforce development programs;
- business and industry development programs;
- life skills and personal growth programs.

As part of the national Cooperative Extension System, in partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the Mississippi State University Extension Service delivers non-formal, lifelong education to Mississippians in every county of the state. MSU Extension is a local needs-based network of educational professionals which includes 92 state specialists and 269 county professionals. Extension delivers educational programs through short courses, conferences, demonstrations, and personal contacts. Faculty use sophisticated distance learning strategies, the World Wide Web and Internet, as well as traditional educational curricula and mass media to reach diverse audiences. Extension's educational programs are wide ranging, meeting workers' needs for certification and on the job skills development, and helping businesses, industries, and local governments become more efficient and effective.

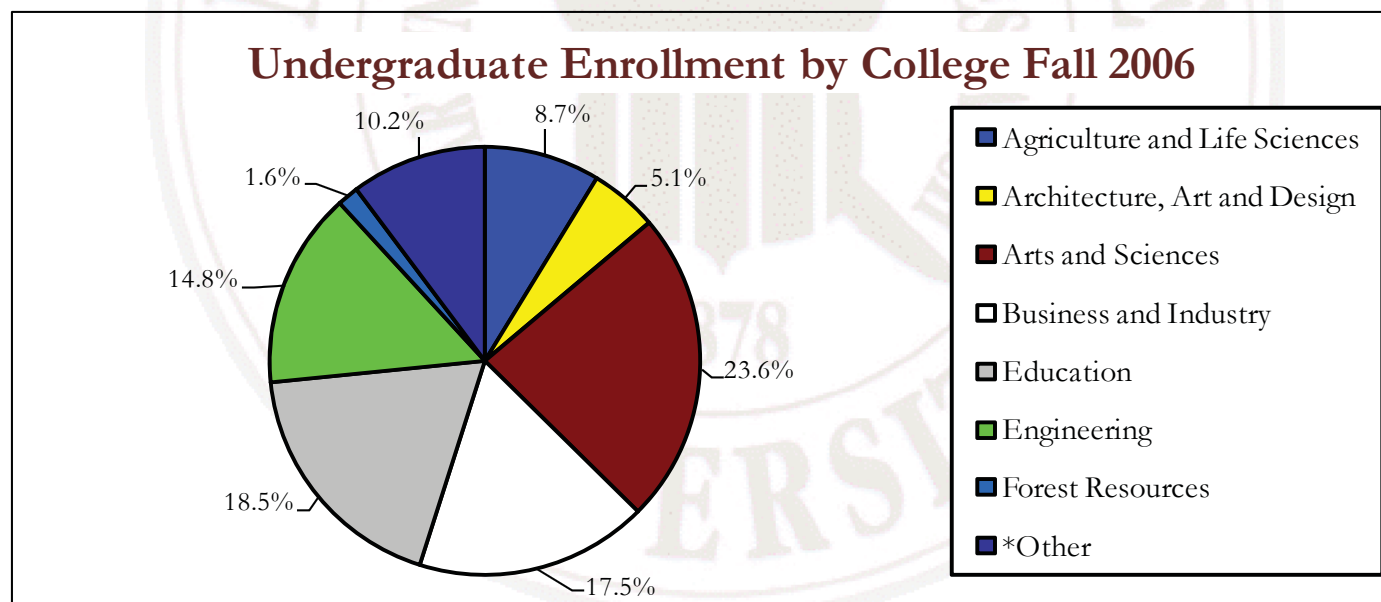

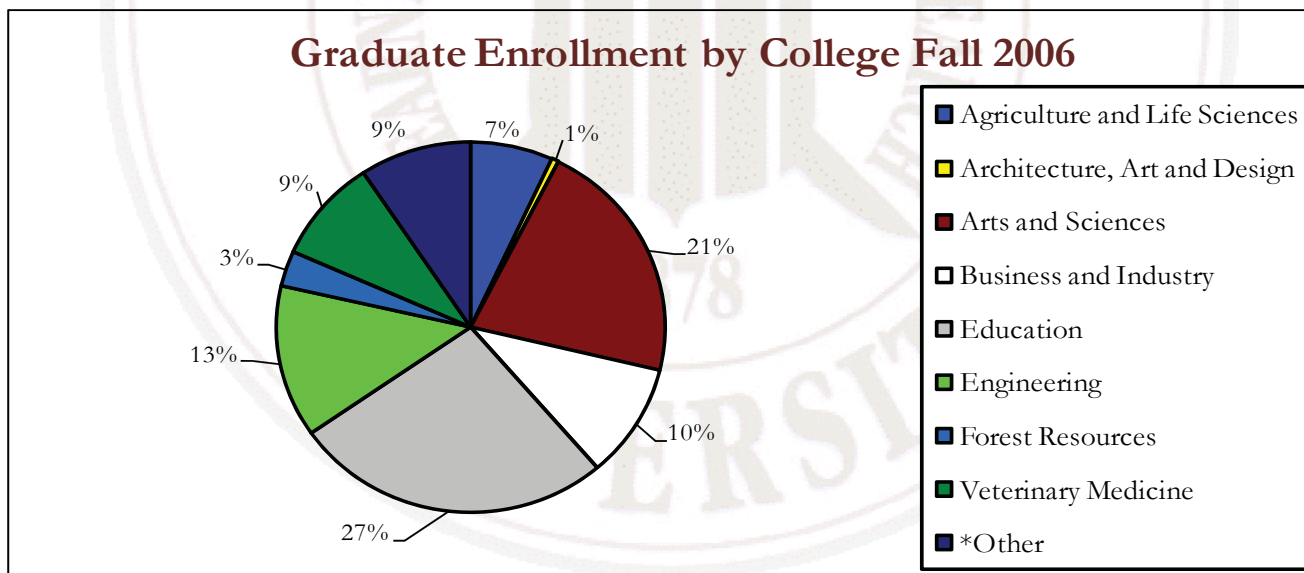

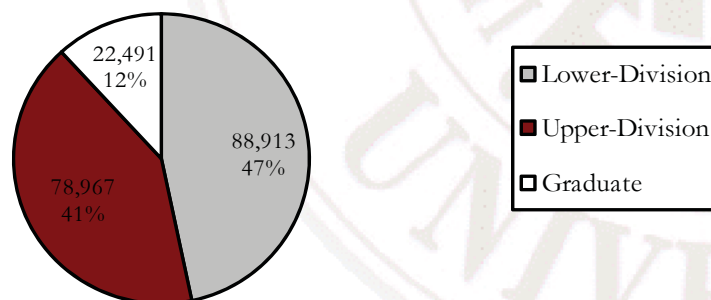

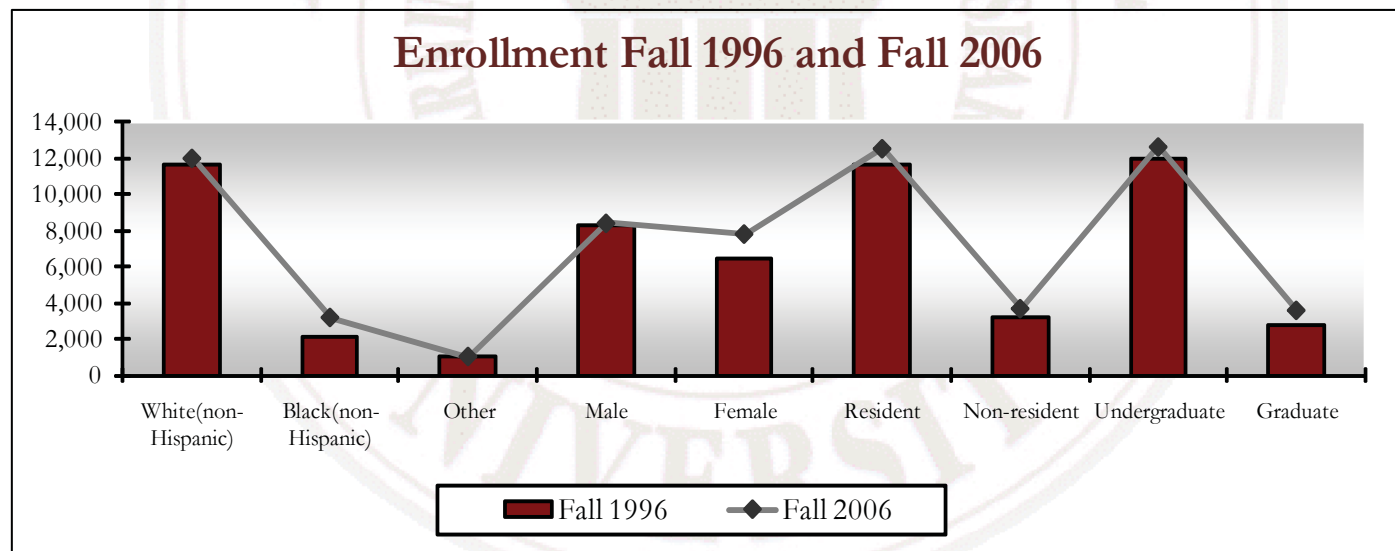

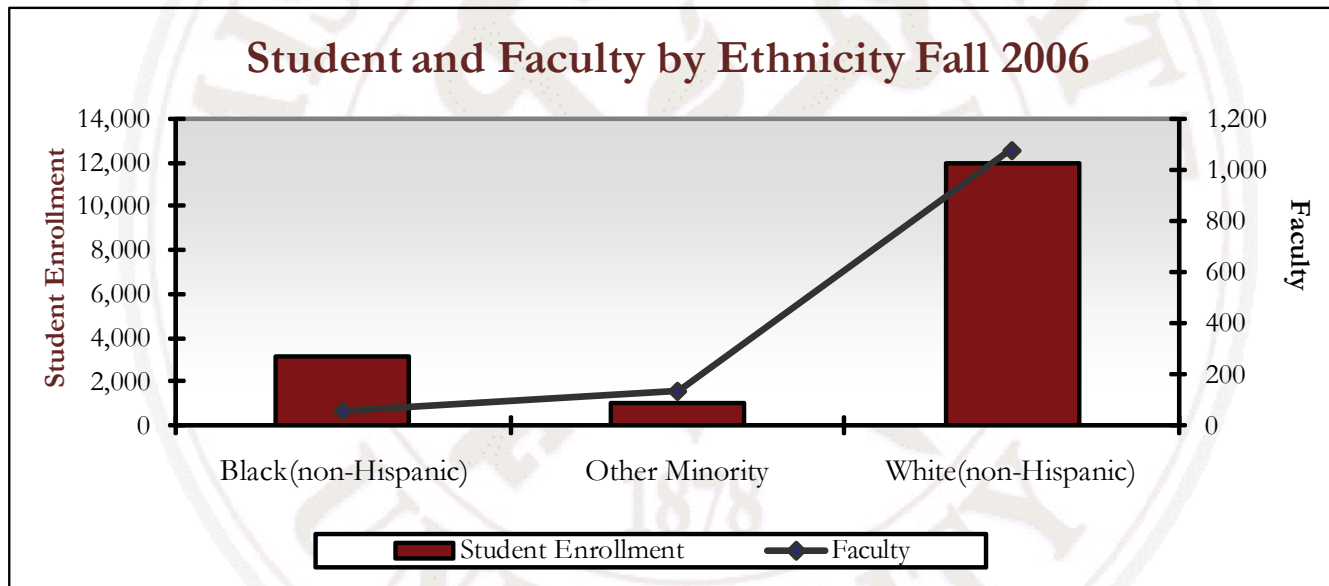

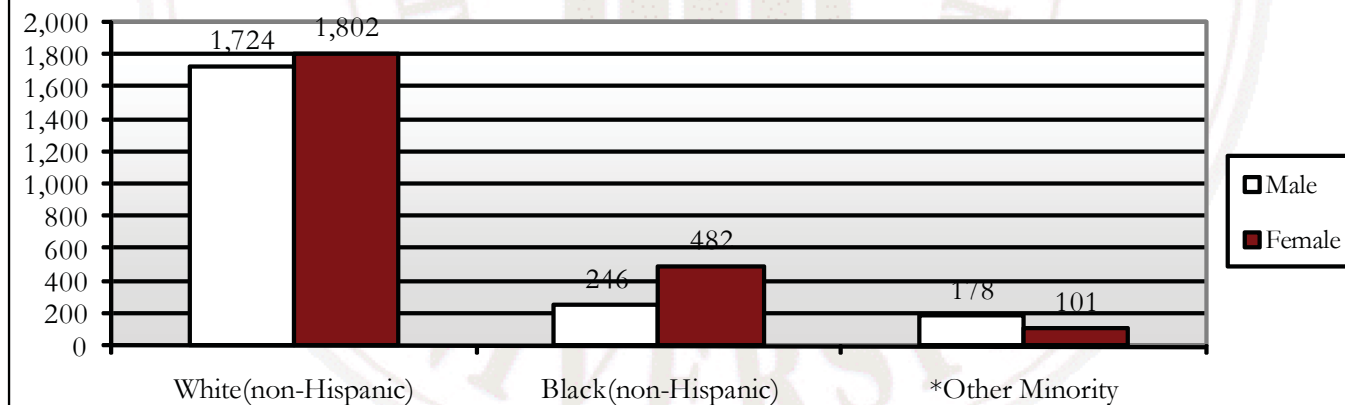

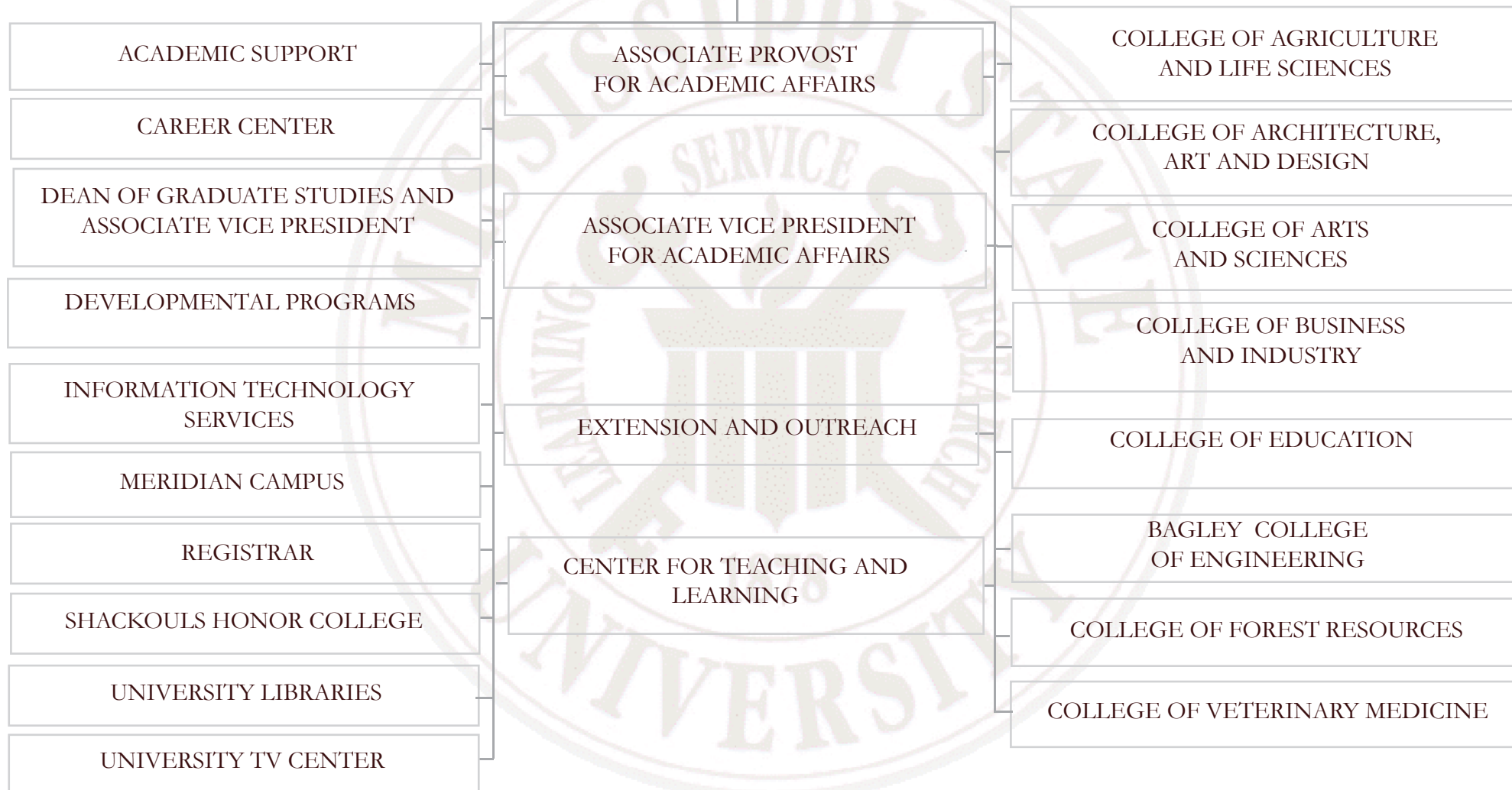

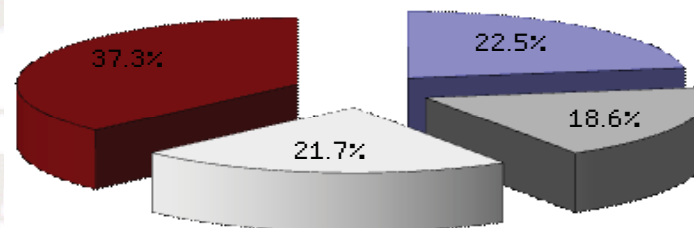

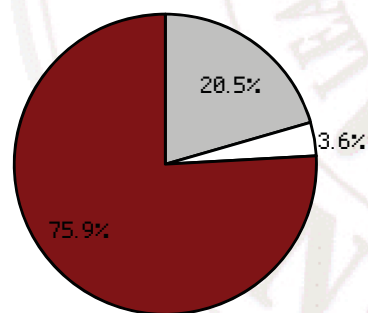

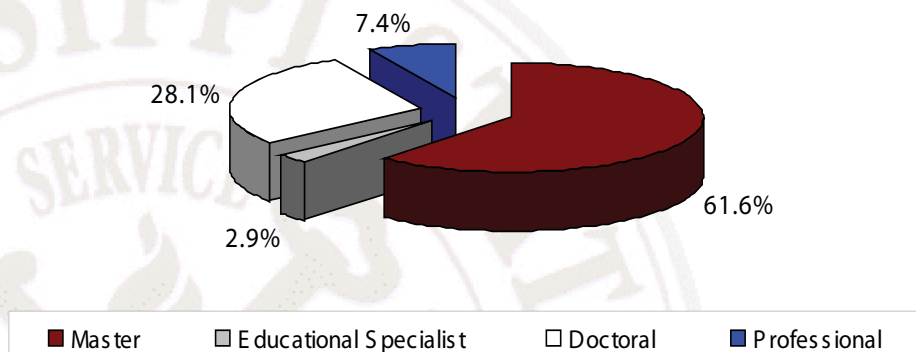

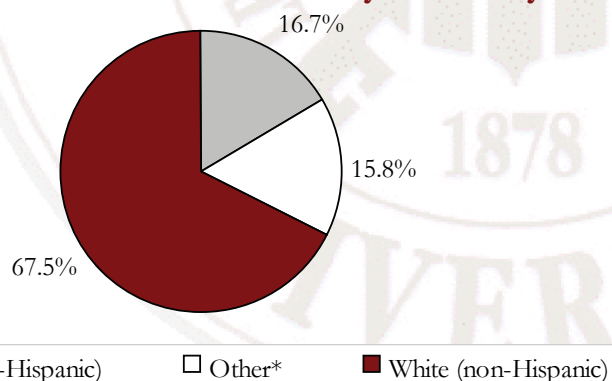

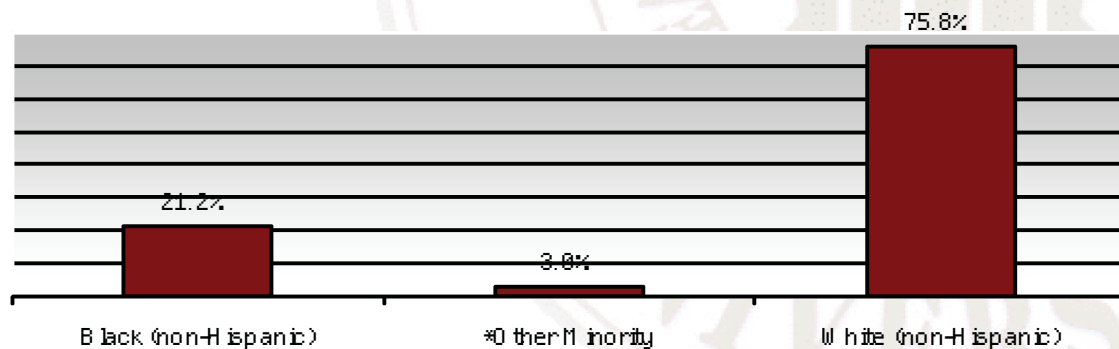

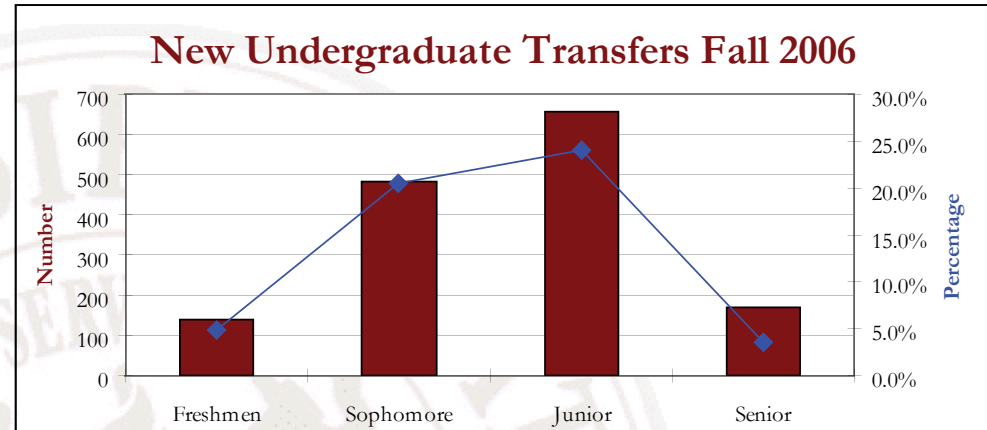

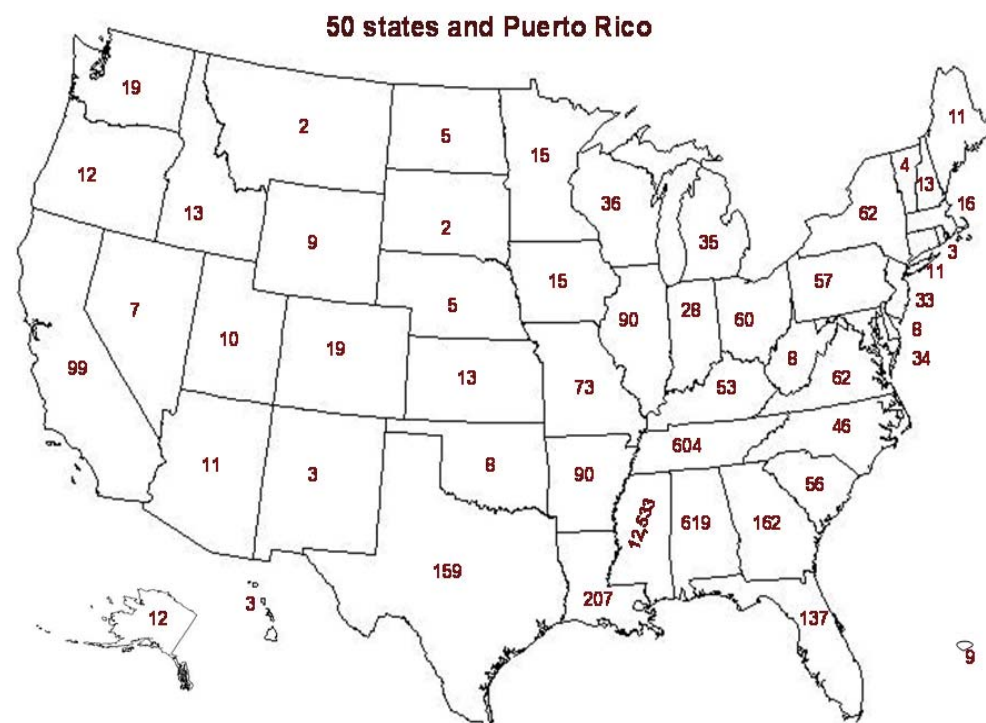
MISSISSIPPI RESIDENTS BY COUNTY FALL 2006

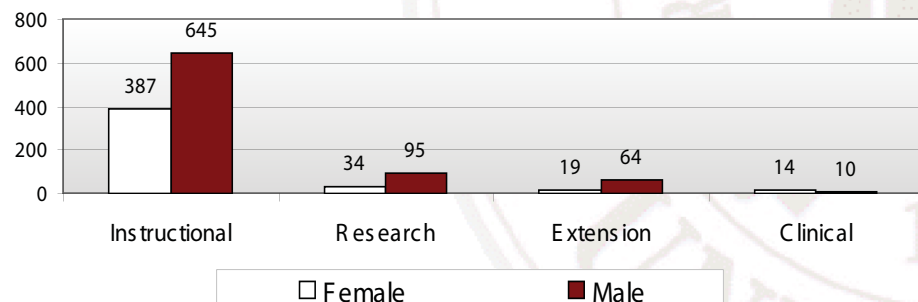

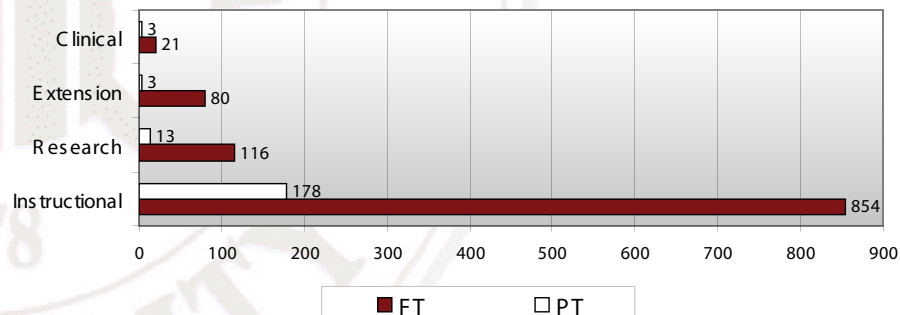

Full-Time/Part-Time Faculty Fall 2006

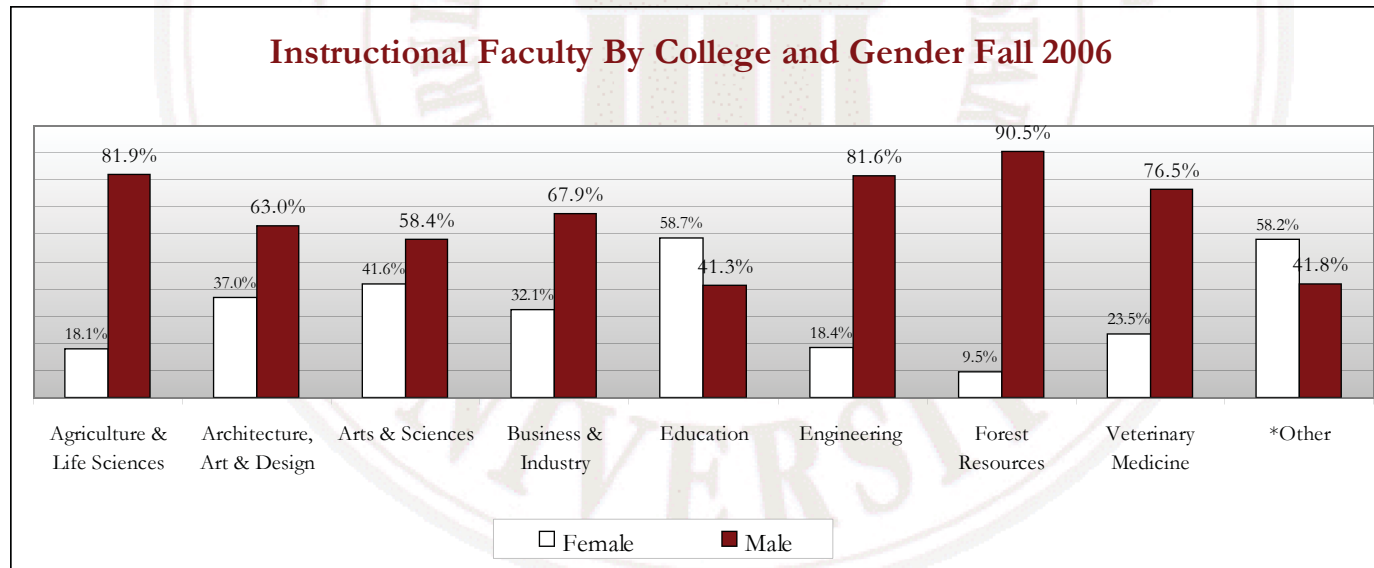

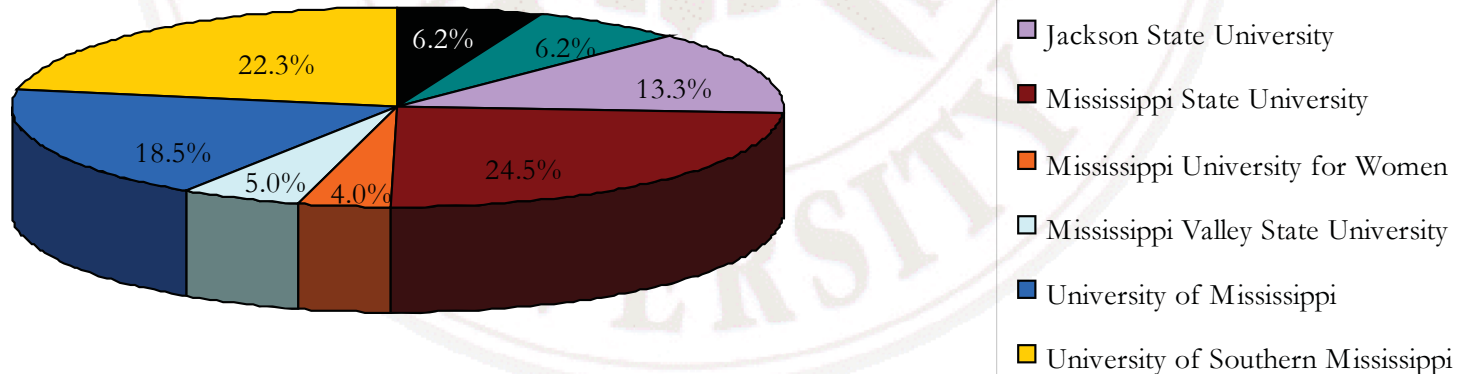

2006 State Appropriations for Higher Education



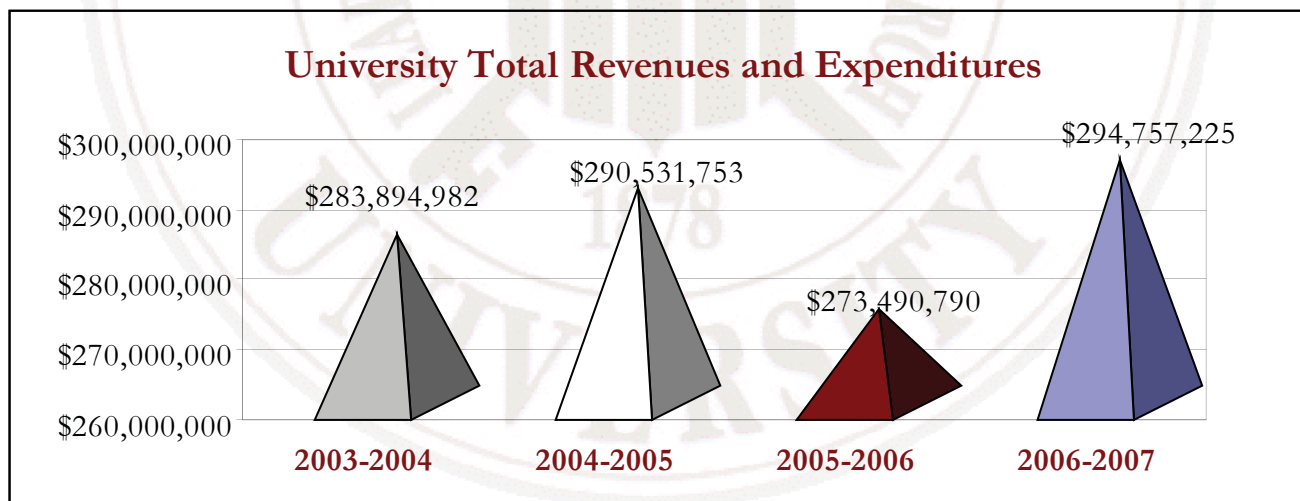

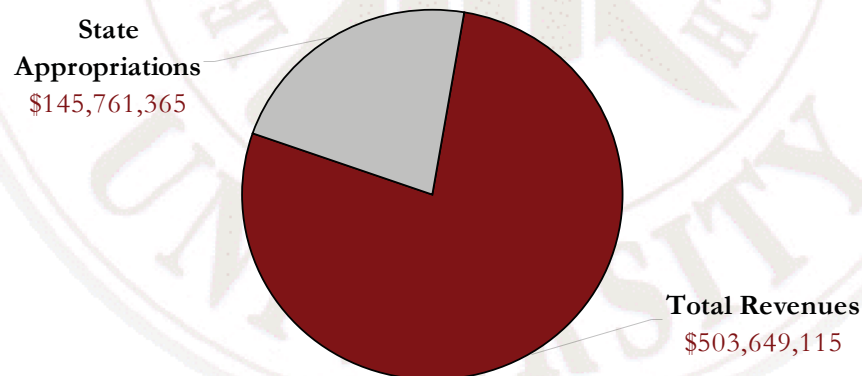

Total Revenues and State Appropriations 2005-2006



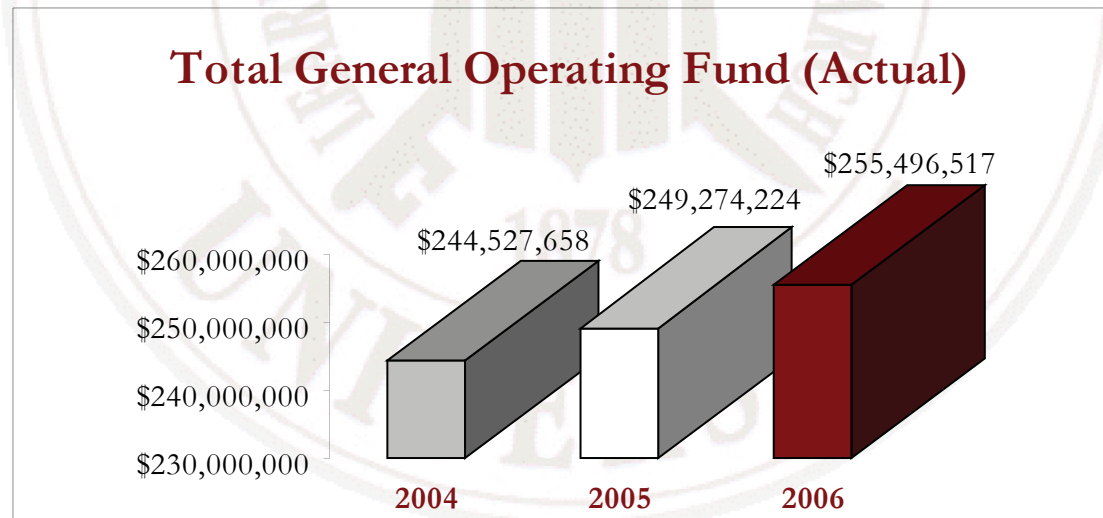

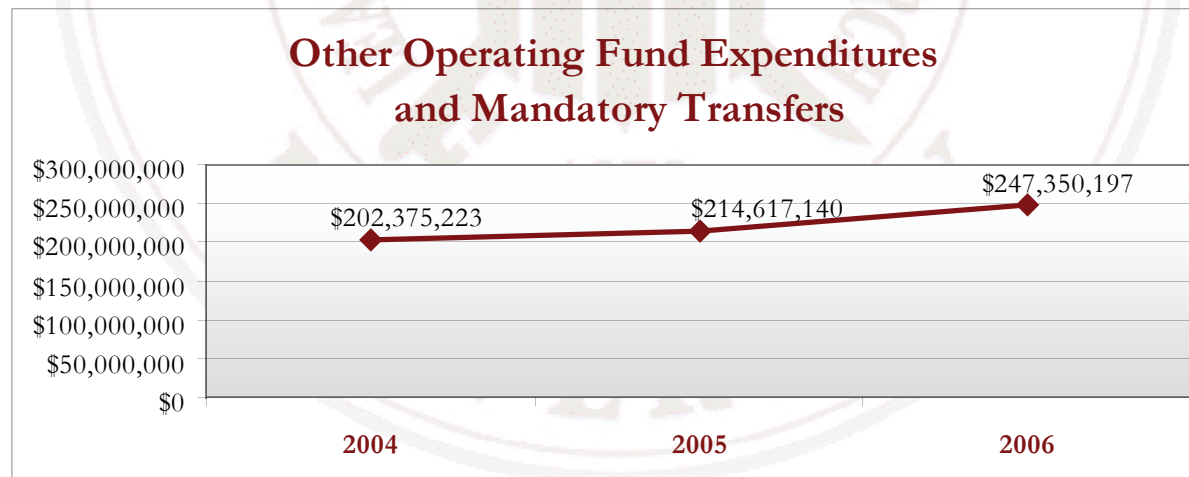

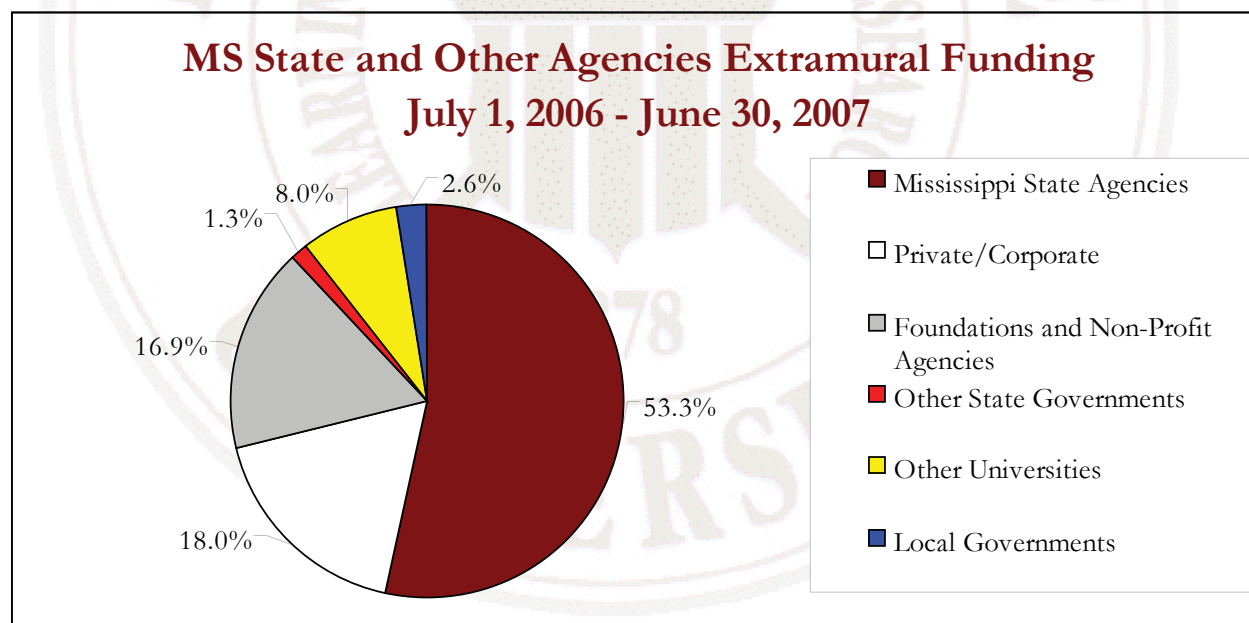

The Office of Institutional Research maintains a list of Institutions and selected data for the purpose of benchmarking.

Why Benchmark?

Simply stated, benchmarking is one of the most powerful tools for initiating and sustaining continuous improvement. Benchmarking over time identifies the results of interventions in an iterative process fostering continuous improvement.

As a Land-Grant Institution, our peers consist of the Institutions that were created out of the Original Morrill Act of 1862. Currently the Office of Institutional Research is using AGB Benchmarking Service for data in many student and faculty comparative areas. This service is a large compilation of IPEDS data. As a source of comparative data in the areas of private giving and endowments, the Voluntary Support of Education (VSE) is used.

The following highlights the areas currently measured:

- Enrollment
- Faculty Numbers and Average Salaries
- Student – Faculty Ratios
- Standardized Test Percentiles
- Percent in Top 10% of High Schools Class
- National Merit / Achievement Awards
- Freshmen to Sophomore Retention Rates
- Six-Year Graduation Rates
- Doctoral Degrees Awarded
- Research Expenditures
- Instructional Expenditures per FTE Student
- Academic Support Expenditures per FTE Student
- Private Support
- Institutional Expenditures
- Endowment Market Values

In addition to the benchmarking with the Land-Grant Institutions, other comparative studies are conducted by Institutional Research to include Faculty Salary Averages by Rank and Discipline, and Administrative Salary Averages using the Southern University Group (SUG) Institutions. For decision-making in specific needs, the office actively participates in a listserv that is supported by the SUG institutions which gives almost immediate comparisons between the thirty-two schools.
