Composite ACT Score for First-Time Freshmen

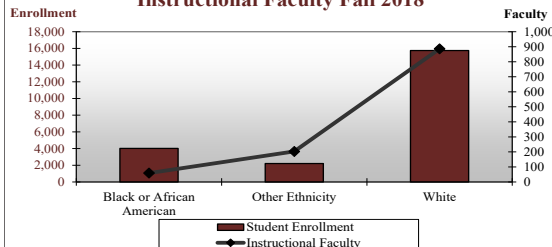

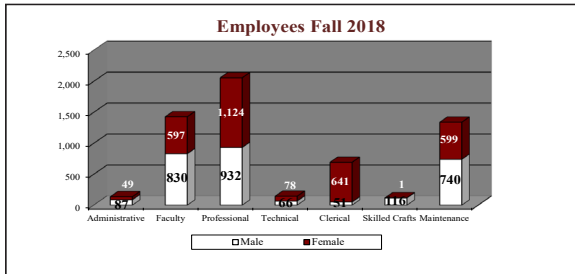

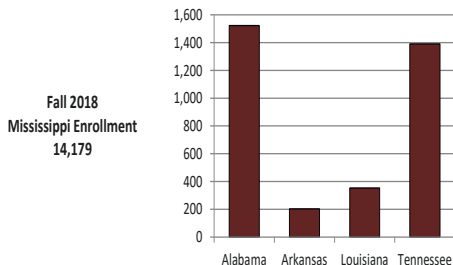

Adjacent States Enrollment Fall 2018



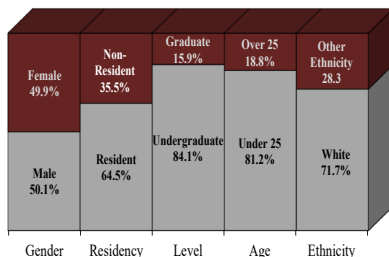

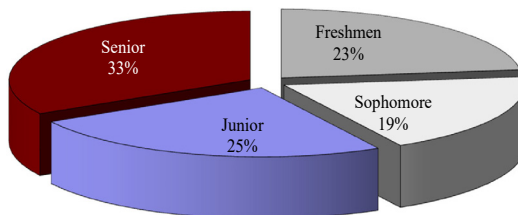

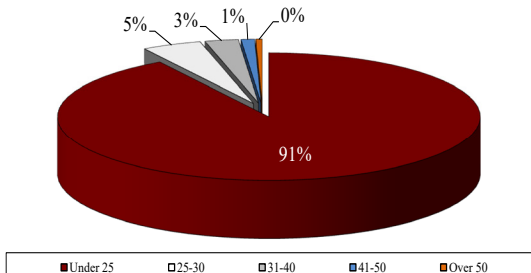
Fall 2018 Undergraduate Class Distribution



Age Distribution by Class

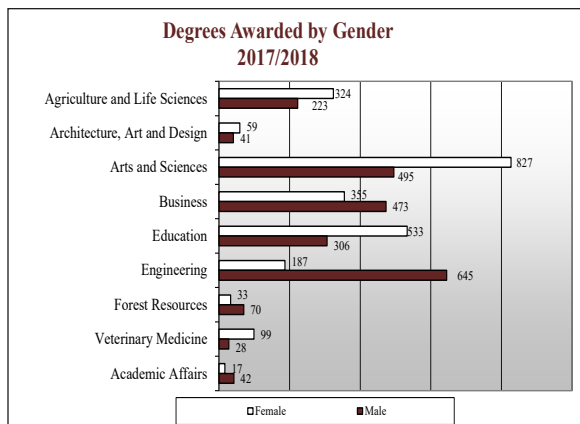

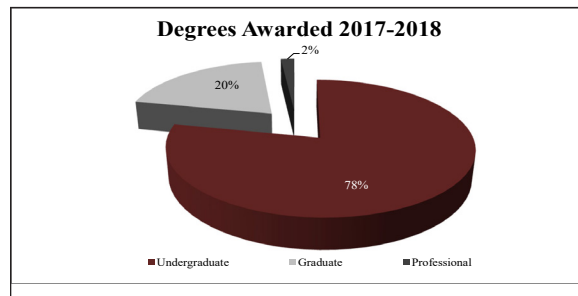

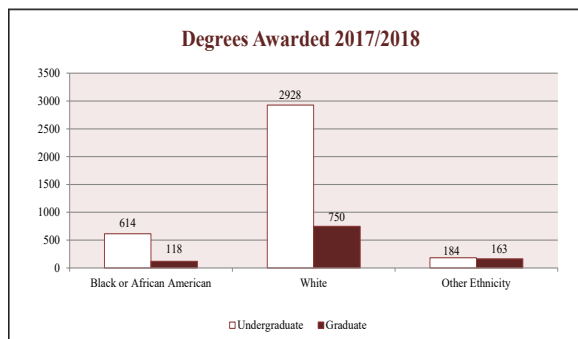

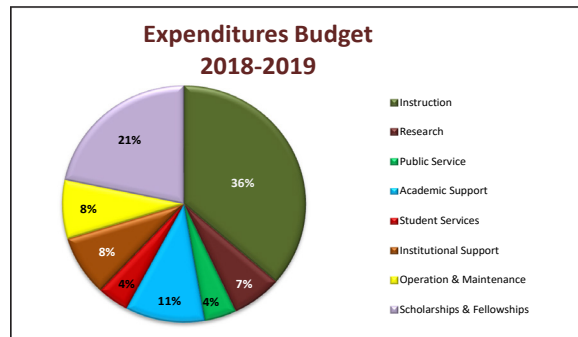
