Composite ACT Score for First-Time Freshmen

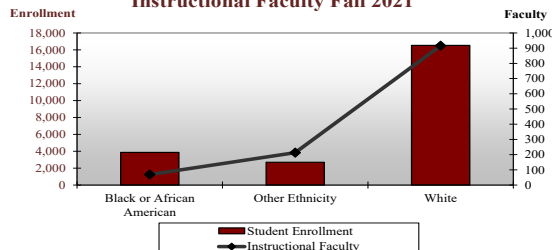

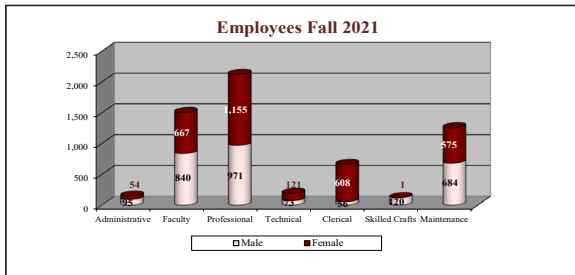

Adjacent States Enrollment Fall 2021



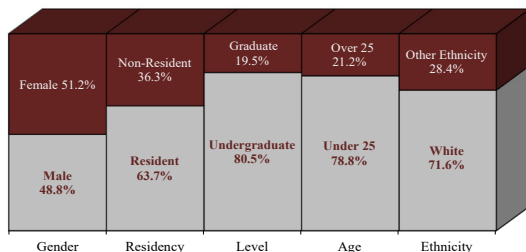

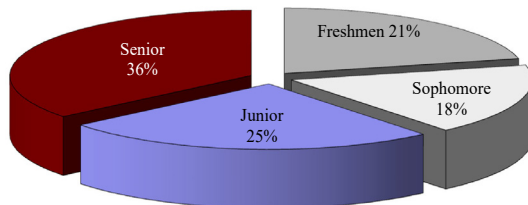

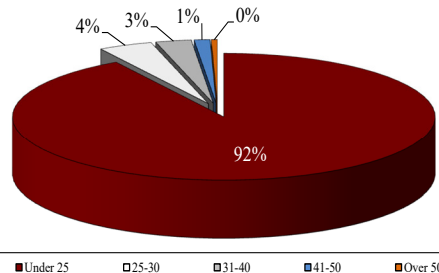
Fall 2021 Undergraduate Class Distribution



Age Distribution by Class

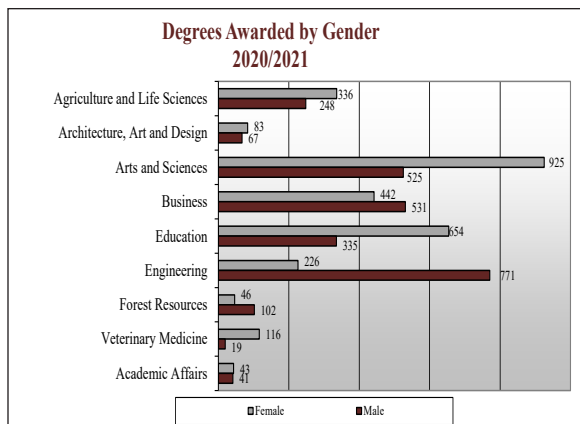

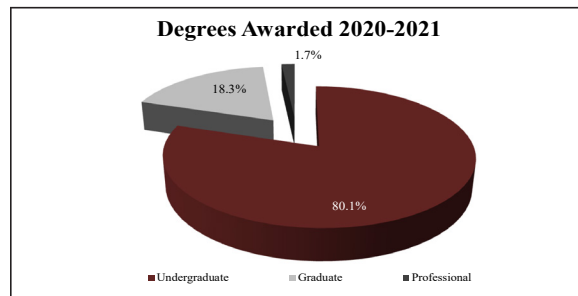

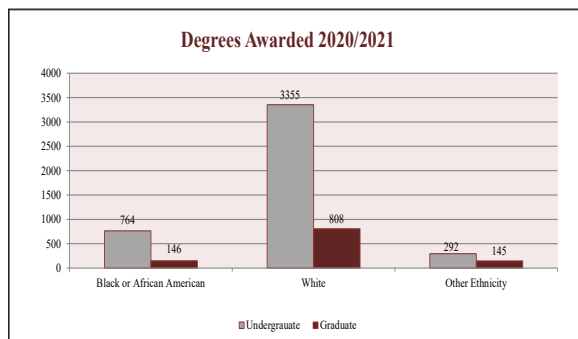

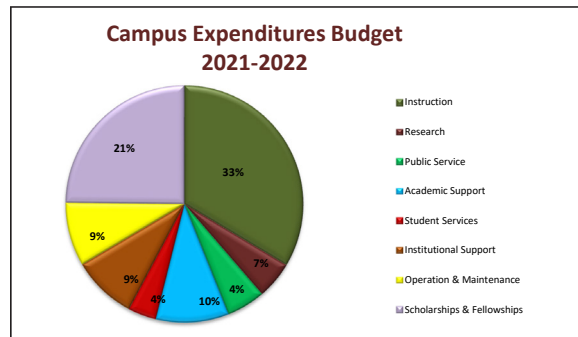
