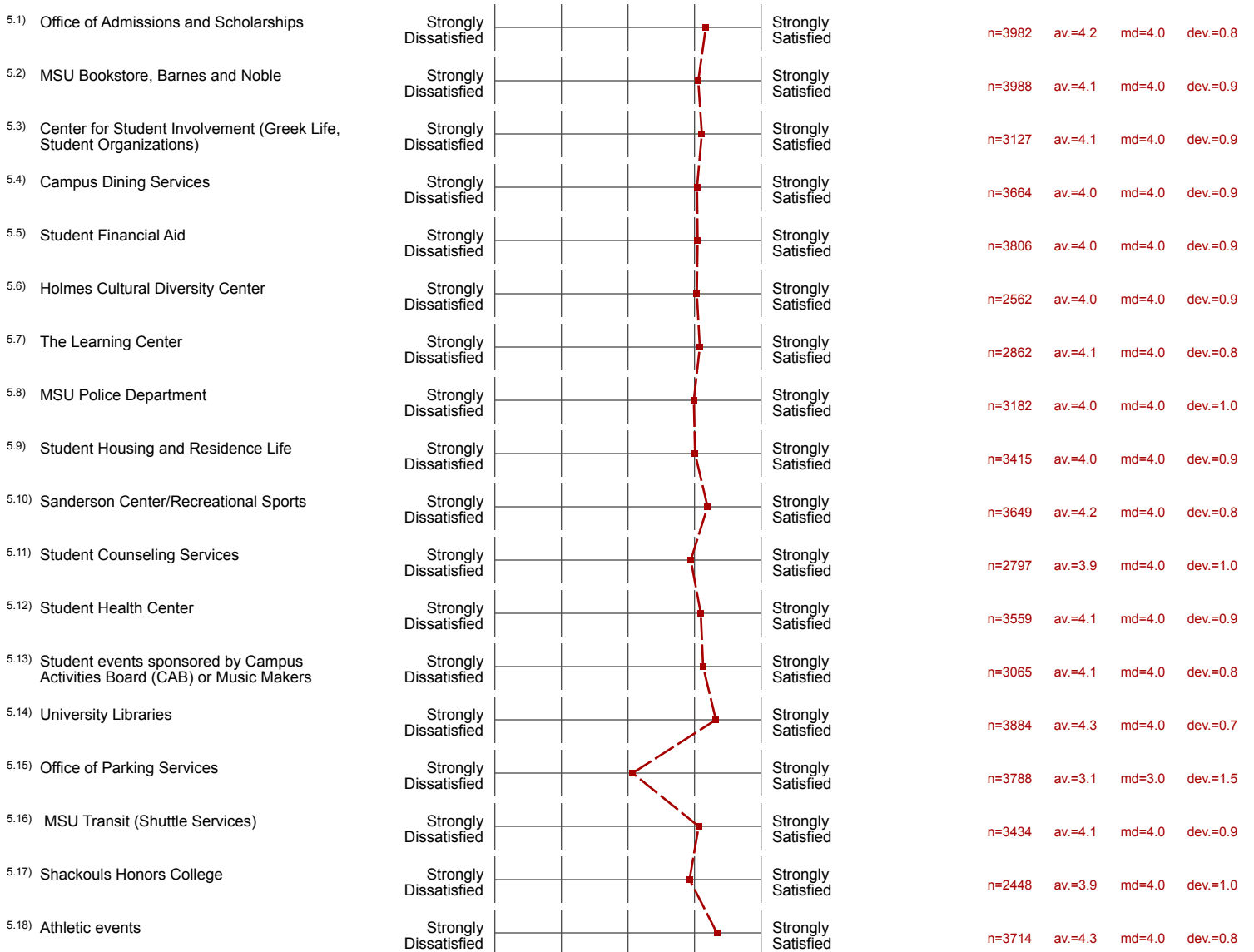

It has forced me to waste money and time, all completely out of my control. My suggestion is to make the leaders of the CMLL scheduling/advising department more organized so it can stop costing students extra time and money to get a degree.
- 500 Characters is not sufficient.
- 500 characters is far too few to meaningfully describe the pros and cons of my college experience.

- A 24/7 building consisting of only study rooms would be life changing for students.
- A facility where minorities can congregate is needed on this pasty campus. The lifting of the masks was a FLOP. People just sneezing and coughing everywhere, just nasty. And the lack of online resources is atrocious. Many professors don't offer WebEx for students that are out with COVID, so it forces you to be extremely behind in the classes or risk spreading the rona and just go to class for notes and attendance.
- A good quality education is what I feel like I received at Mississippi State. Thank you.
- A wider variety of gen ed classes. Please. Geology is useless to me and so is calculus. Allow more classes that may better align with our degrees and concentrations. I felt like I was wasting time, money and energy learning topics that didn't aid me in my quest to graduation. Just include more options and suggestions that might best go along with someone's major/ concentration.
- ASE needs improving. I had to do a fifth year for a variety of reasons that I would link to the faults in the ASE department. ASE MUST listen to student opinions, prioritize the quality of education, and find ways to offer classes in more semesters. I am VERY concerned that EM courses are doing recitation. Please invest in Supplemental Instruction for EM courses for students that are funding their education, contributing to the success of MSU, and going into the world representing MSU.
- Absolutely love MSU except for my last experience where I was not awarded my degree even though I did not do anything wrong. I was swept under the rug and not taken seriously. This was really upsetting and showed a lot about the school.
- Academic Advisors are not on the same page and I know MULTIPLE people that had to take an extra semester of classes bc their advisor didn't plan their curriculum correctly.
- Academic Advisors did not know what I needed when I transferred and every semester I was here.
- Academic advising after Freshman year should be optional because college students should be able to determine which classes to take from the curriculum specific materials provided by each department. Parking fines in Greek lots should end early on Monday as there aren't enough spots for members to park at chapter. Also, fraternity/sorority members should be allowed to park at their house for lunch regardless of the parking pass they have.
- Academic advising was really bad. Had tons of great club experience. Had more terrible teachers than I thought I was going to have. Love the landscaping around campus
- Add more parking spaces to the commuter east parking lot or don't oversell the parking permits.
- Advising for Aerospace engineering was severely lacking. There is only one person who is able to truly do anything with advising and that is Machaunda Bush. She works so hard and does incredible things. She is only one person, however, and as such cannot do everything for every aspiring aerospace engineer, or at least not in a timely manner. This needs to be remedied, especially considering how quickly our department is growing.

- Advising for transfer students should not be of such a hassle. I had CAAP compliance and pre-requisite errors that made registering for classes an absolute hassle every semester (6) I was enrolled at MSU. An overall great experience at Mississippi State. Thank you all for everything! Thanks, Austin
- Advising should be more personable. Students should have one advisor all the way through instead of a different one each semester. The Career Center should know more about opportunities for engineering students and there should be better communication between ALL departments and services across campus.
- Advisors need more training- my advisor didn't know the curriculum, tried to sign me up for classes that didn't exist, and messed up my graduation timeline multiple times. Additionally, the master class schedule was consistently not scheduled to match the curriculum (ie: two classes required to be taken in the same semester were scheduled at the same time/ some classes only had a 1/3 of the number of seats required to accommodate all the students who needed to take the class to graduate on time)
- Advisors should actually be good at their job and take more initiative
- Advisors should take their job seriously and try their hardest to answer their students back as fast as possible.
- After four years, I know I made the right decision coming to State!
- After one semester at Auburn University I decided to relocate and transfer to Mississippi State University. I can proudly say that was the best decision I have ever made. The friends I have made at MSU I would never trade for the world and the same goes for the education I have received for the past 3 and a half years. I am extremely proud to call myself a Mississippi State Bulldog and will continue to cherish these times after graduation. Thank you MSU.
- All of my advisors before Wendy did not truly advise me, they asked for a list of classes that they approved like a car on autopilot. No one ever asked why I was doing terribly in school. No one contacted me when I was forced to stop attending for a semester. No one looked at my declining academic performance and wondered if something was going on. I did not feel like I can talk to my advisors for help. Only after I was switched to Wendy Dandass did I have an advisor I could rely on for help.
- All of the courses I studied at MSU were very good for my career growth. Many courses were challenging and required a lot of efforts. I became more hard working and dedicated to my future due to courses at MSU. Moreover, I would say my entire life changed at MSU. I chose to become a data scientist after studying CS at MSU. The courses really helped me get necessary knowledge and skills for getting success.
- Allowing hate speech to be shared on your campus is not very welcoming

MSU does ANYTHING to grab money from vulnerable & desperate students. It's really tainted my view of MSU.
- As a black Comm. major theres little diversity here. The majority of my classes consisted of the same white ppl, so really there was no place to learn through diversity like how people say you should during college. I believe this change can be made internally as well. I have had one Black professor and one Asian professor, both of which I really love! These professors themselves have brought up how the department lacks diversity in its faculty and staff, so I believe this should be changed.
- As a full-time online student, my advisor Chris was hands down the best advisor for someone online. He was always attentive and gave me the best advice during my academic journey.
- As a hearing-impaired student, the responses to accommodation requests by professors has been appalling. MSU needs to help all disabilities, and I hope MSU works with the DRC to provide a welcoming educational environment for us. A seminar that informs staff about disabilities and how accommodations are necessary for our success would improve the disability culture on campus. The response to the pandemic felt like safety was not priority. Masks should have always been enforced by staff.
- As a high school senior, Mississippi State was my last choice in schools due to my desire to travel out of state. But, I could not imagine what life would be like had I not decided to come to State. I will be forever grateful for the people and the experiences that I had here.
- As a native New Yorker, I never would have thought i would end up in Starkville for my degree. Thank you for everything you have done. I am so grateful for my years at Mississippi State and I would do it all again.
- As a regular student I would recommend MSU if you are looking for a famous that's peaceful. As an athlete, its a hard NO for me.
- As a transfer student it was really short lived, I wish I would have attended here my Freshman year and got the full college experience.

- As an Education major, who must complete a semester of student teaching internship before graduating, I find it obscured that we pay full tuition for this semester of schooling. I am not looking for a payment for this internship position, but I do believe that a large percentage of our tuition should be docked. - Dr. Stephanie Lemley does not need to be an advisor for the College of Education. I almost had to take an additional semester because she failed to mention that I needed a Fine Arts credit. She was rude and inconsiderate when I came to her during a time of need. My mother, who does not work for the University nor did she attend this University, was leaps and bounds better as an advisor than Dr. Stephanie Lemley.

- The General Science CAPP has been confusing at times. My former advisor for General Science was difficult to contact and was very helpful or understanding. However, Emily Cain is the best advisor I have had in my time here. She is truly amazing!
- The INDT department is a joke. It really should be investigated as I feel the other students and myself are being deprived of an education in which we are paying for.
- The MSU Library could be more advance in technology with offering different software. I do believe there should be more than one library on campus .
- The MSU administration fails to represent ethnic and racial groups in this way -- most administrators of color are confined to HCDC or ODI. As a member of the Student Association for four years, in my many committee meetings with university administration and faculty, the only representation in those meetings comes from students when present and professors.
- The Shackouls Honors College could use improvement on offering more of a variety of classes. Most of the courses offered by the Honors College are not applicable to students choosing to pursue degrees in STEM or other non-liberal arts degrees. Additionally, more courses could be offered covering subject matters pertaining to current events and current philosophical debates, rather than focusing so heavily on older literature and history courses.
- The University could use more caring professors who realize students aren't perfect. More professors who speak better english also, it's hard to learn when you cannot understand the professor.
- The University needs to stop violating State Law by denying Enhanced Concealed Carry Permit Holders entrance into Davis-Wade and the Dude while lawfully armed. You are in fact in violation of State Law.
- The advising needs improvement as well as the health center needs to have better bedside manner.

- The courses required to graduate and updated major/degree qualifications needs to be updated more consistently so that ONLINE students can plan ahead for which courses they need to take since only a limited number of the ONLINE sections are available each semester. Also, the counseling/advising service provided seemed to be rushed quite a bit, and wanted to get me off the phone as quickly as possible.
- The degree structure is antiquated and broken. A technology degree should not require advanced math, in the same way that a math or science degree should not require Human Resources or Technology classes. I found most of my classes to be largely ineffective and unnecessary for my degree and career trajectory. I will pursue certifications rather than a master's degree, and I advise those in my field to do the same.
- The dining service and the parking and transit service needs a complete overhaul. MSU also needs to work on streamlining processes for scheduling and approvals for classes. There were multiple times I had to go to multiple different offices to get into a class. There has got to be a better way to do this. Overall, most of my experience was positive. The sporting events are

fantastic, employees in other departments were great, the campus is gorgeous, and the school traditions are amazing.

- The distance learning through MSU was excellent. I would recommend to any prospective student.
- The engineering department needs to take a look at the teachers' ability to communicate. Several of them are very intelligent but have trouble communicating with students. Some teachers also expect students to spend an impossible amount of time on their class to succeed.

- The industrial technology department needs help. A hands on degree requires you to put your hands on which was rarely the case during my time here at MSU. I believe for the amount of space, equipment, tuition paid by students, and everything else that has gone into this department, there's been a serious failure to provide the proper training for the real world. There are several pieces of equipment that sit there and never get used, only talked about.
- The instructors are very knowledgeable and nice.
- The internship program was great! Got me a job before I even graduated. The cafeterias were AMAZING. Nice staff and food. The ECE department could be better. Quite a few bad teachers (Follet) and bad equipment. It's clear you guys didn't put much money into the program. Felt overall that MSU cared more for my money than me.
- The lack of funding and support to club sports is a joke especially compared to other Schools in the SEC. I have been a president of the Rugby team for the last three years and it really is just plan sad to experience the lack of support and funding. How are club sports suppose to grow if there is no help? The whole club sports staff should just start over, because the system put into place isn't working.
- The majority of my professors seem to only be at the college for research purposes. I feel like my education was mostly self-driven and most of my instructors were not available to help me at all. If I had to start over and I knew what I knew now, then I would not choose Mississippi State University for my aerospace engineering degree with a focus in astronautics.
- The math instructors are great, but the professors do an abysmal job of teaching their classes.
- The mechanical engineering department relies far too heavily on graduate students who have never taught before to teach complex classes. In addition, many professors who have already obtained their degrees are well past their prime and have a severe disconnect with the current state of engineering and technology. There are not nearly enough hands-on opportunities provided throughout the curriculum, and many things we learn instead seem to have no industry applications.
- The mechanical engineering department underwent a few changes during my time at MSU. The curriculum was changed to require Python although it was not required when I took programming. Physics 2 and 3 were rough and common consensus is to take them elsewhere. Some elderly professors continue teaching though their lectures are unproductive and their ability is lacking. Some of these aren't real faults, others require reexamination.
- The meteorology faculty truly upholds the prestigious reputation as the professor's truly are caring, brilliant, and are willing to go the extra distance to make sure you're prepared for the real world!
- The one general component missing from online education is that I felt that some instructors are not proficient with the Canvas LMS. Some additional training for faculty and staff would clear up a lot of the student confusion surrounding instruction via the LMS.

Faculty should make sure students are taking the right classes instead of having them pick the classes and at the last minute tell them they might not graduate due to their lack of looking over your requirements more often . I visited the one at Ole Miss (I know we hate them), and I was blown away at the level of involvement and the rigor of the honors college. Surprisingly when I would ask their students about the difficulty, they actually enjoyed the challenge. I think this shows how they treat the program there. From the structure of our honors college to the atmosphere in the physical honors college, I think we can create a better environment.

I was unable to seek counseling when I was depressed because of the student counseling waiting list. Where is my tuition going if not to issues that directly

impact my learning? Listen to your students. If majority of a class has a failing grade, that is obviously a teaching issue.
