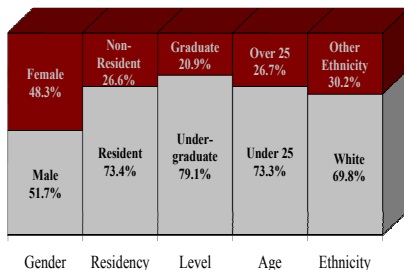

Student Characteristics Fall 2010



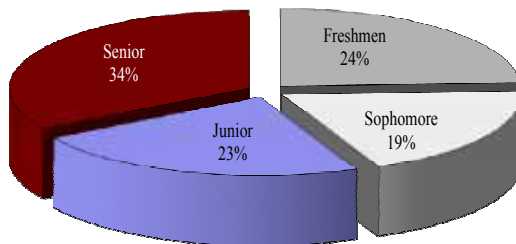

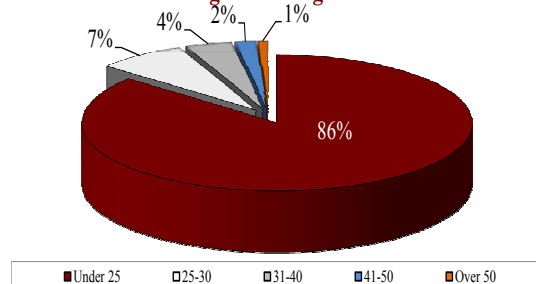
Fall 2010 Undergraduate Class Distribution



Age Distribution by Class

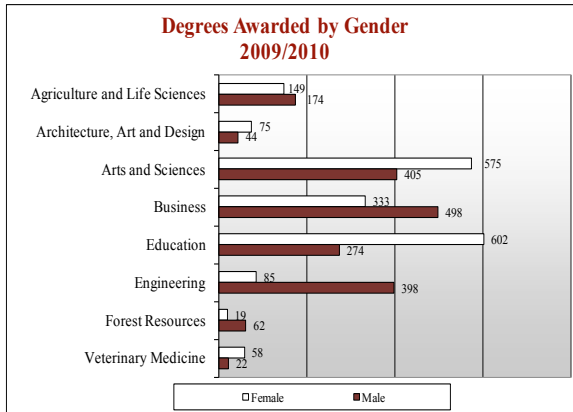

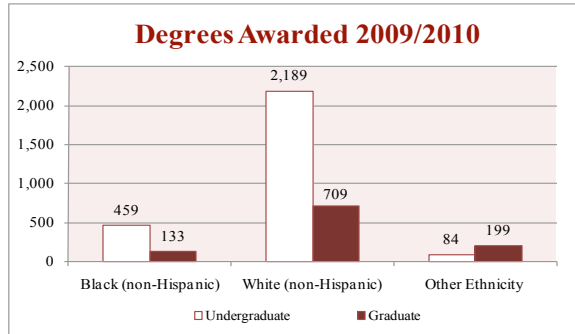

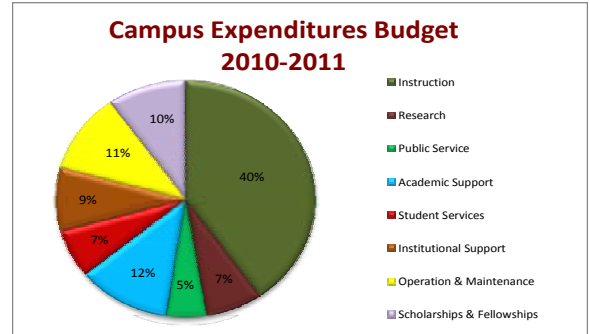
