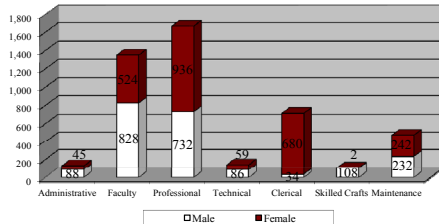

### Student Characteristics Fall 2011



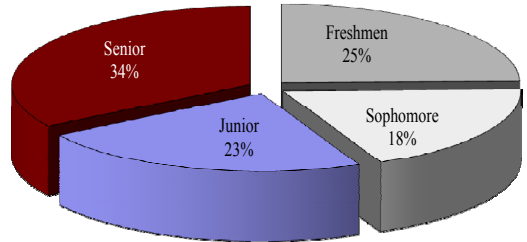

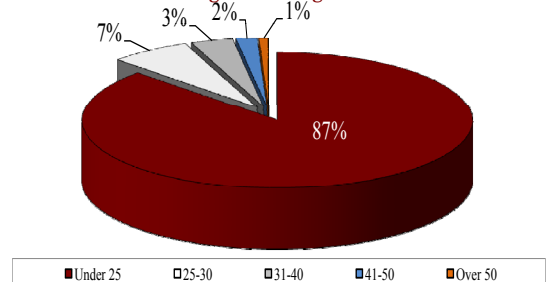
### Fall 2011 Undergraduate Class Distribution

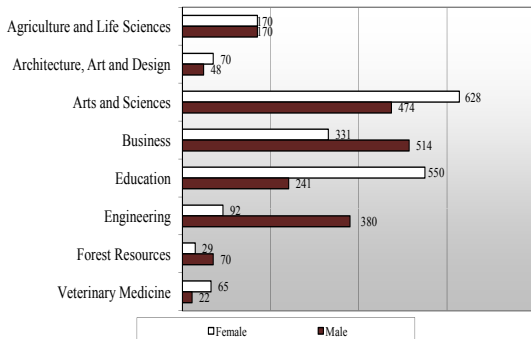
### Fall 2011 Undergraduate Age Distribution

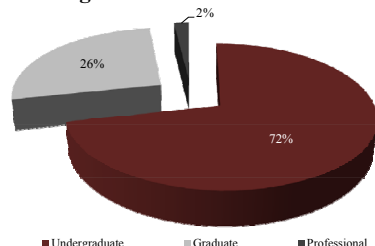

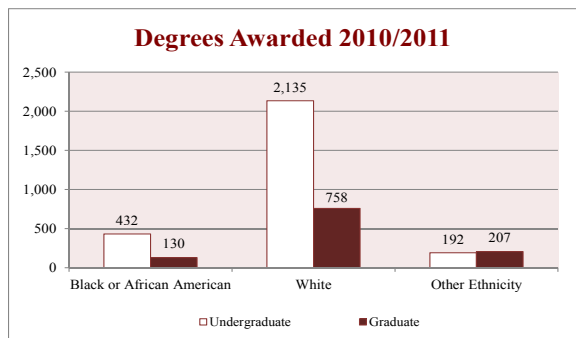

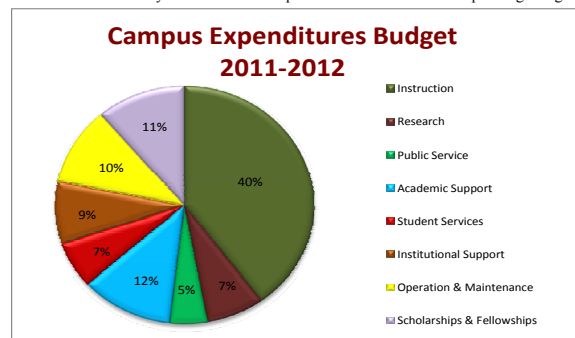
