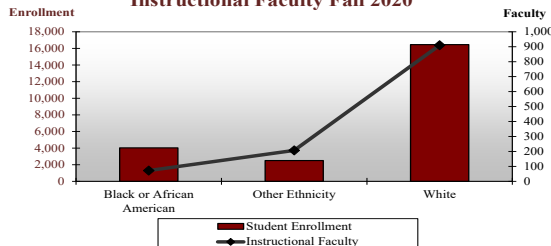

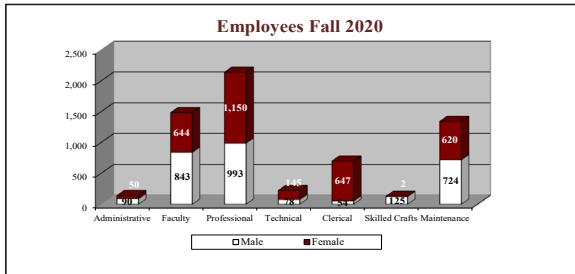

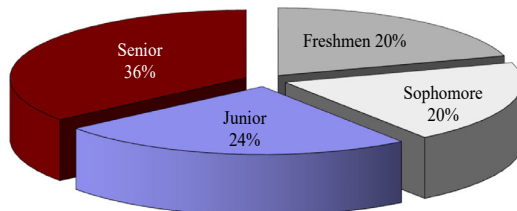

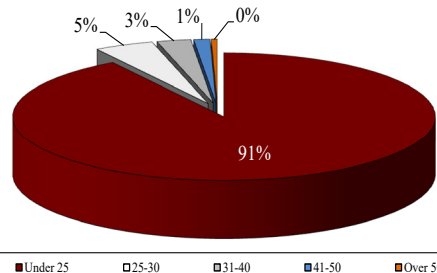
### Fall 2020 Undergraduate Class Distribution

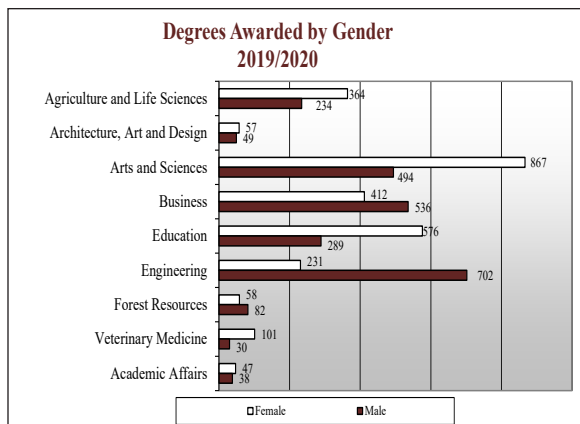
