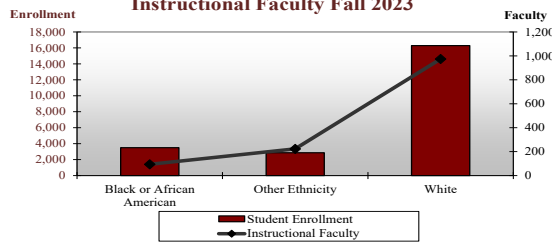

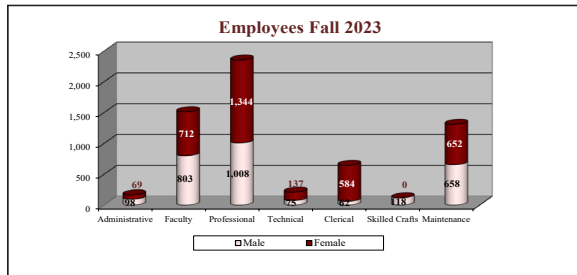

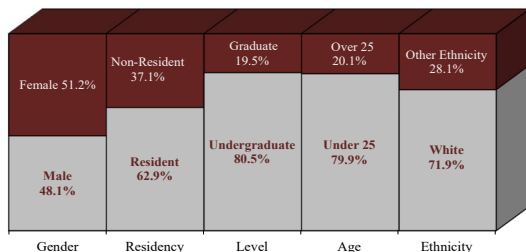

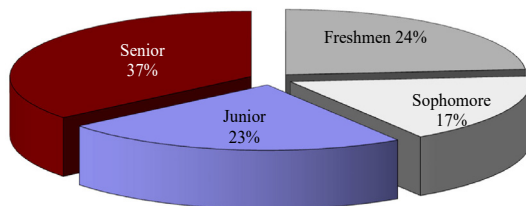

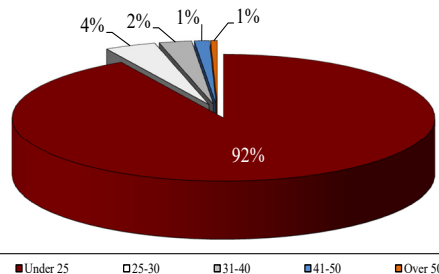
### Fall 2023 Undergraduate Class Distribution

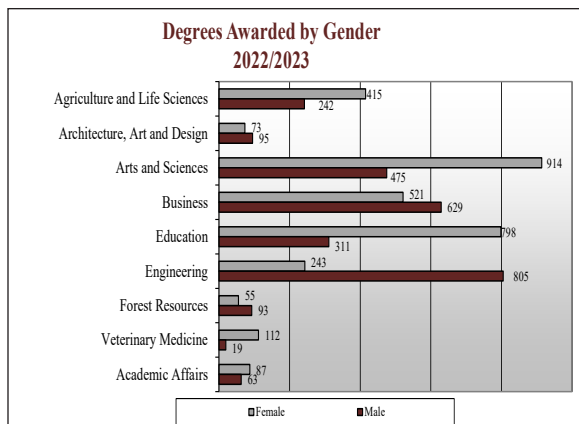
