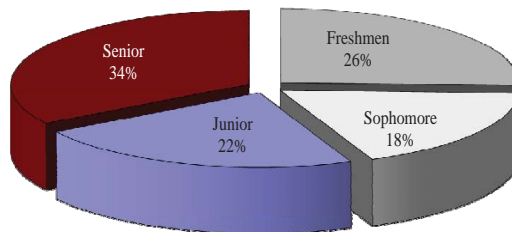

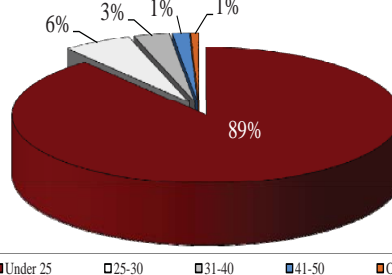
**Fall 2013 Undergraduate Class Distribution**

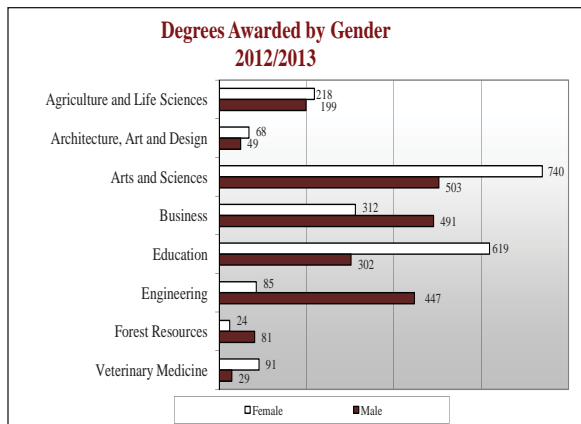

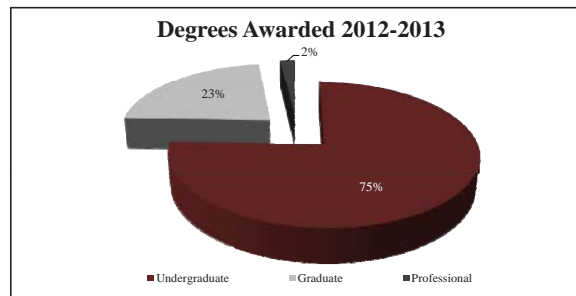

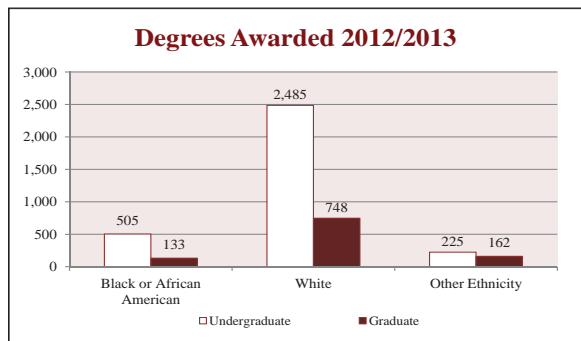

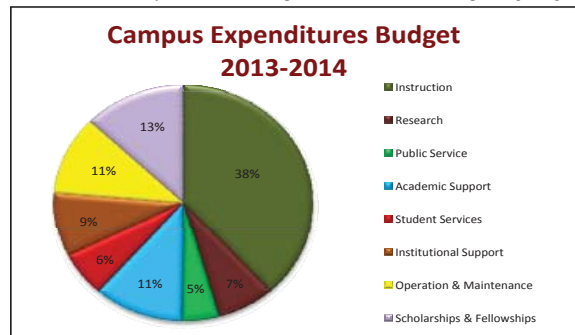
