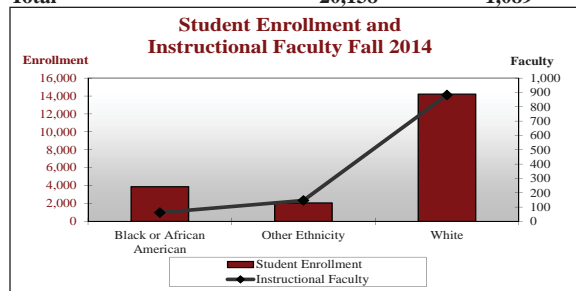

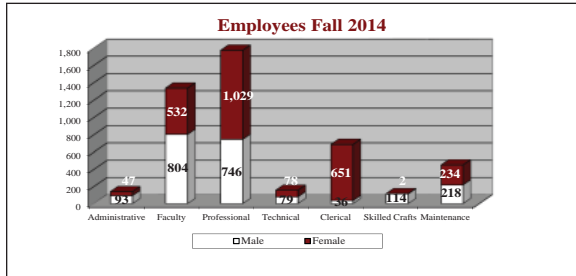

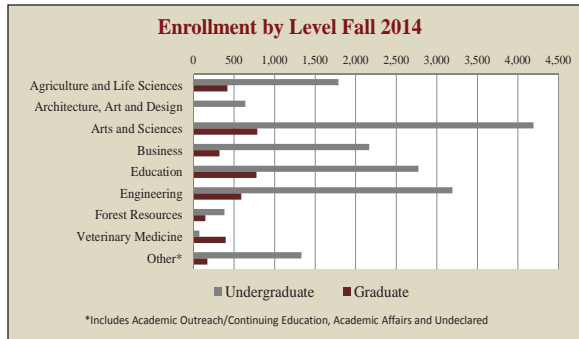

Enrollment by Mississippi County

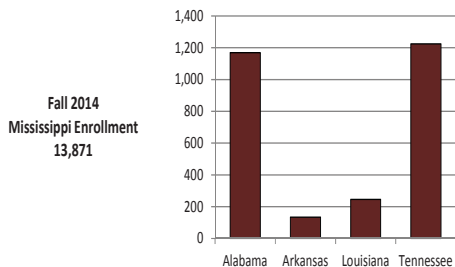

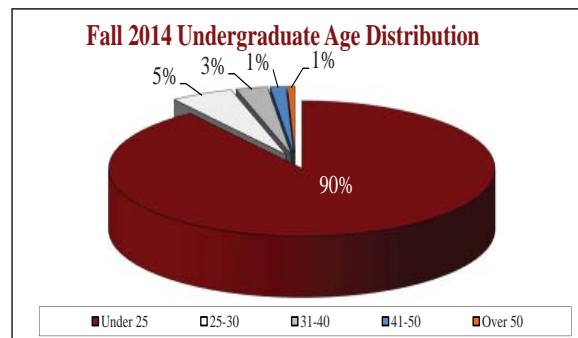

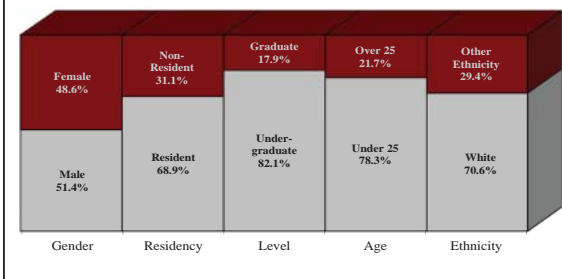


Age Distribution by Class

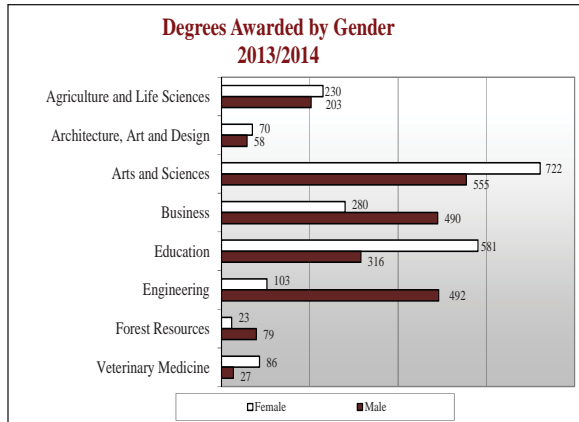

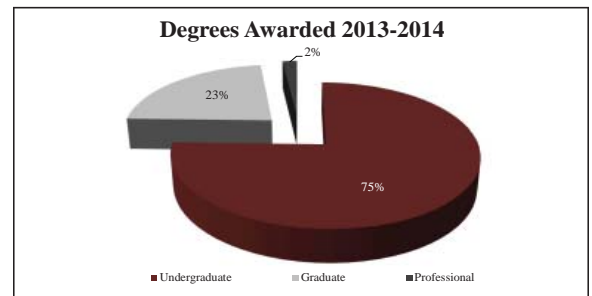

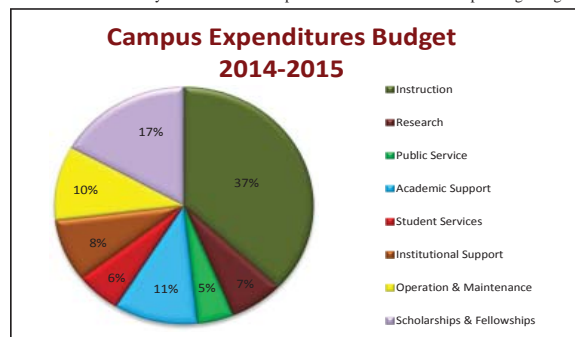
