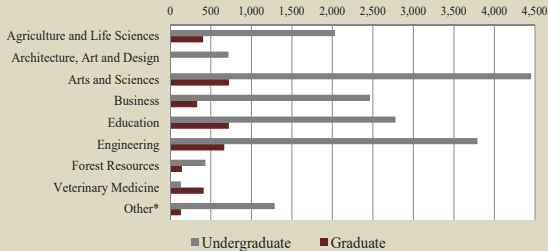

Adjacent States Enrollment Fall 2016



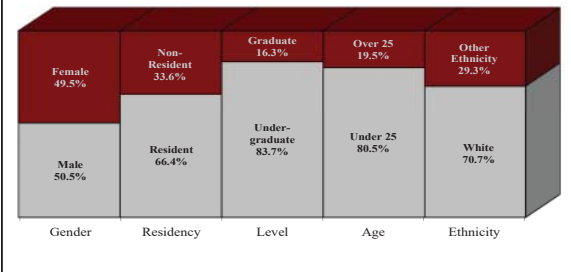

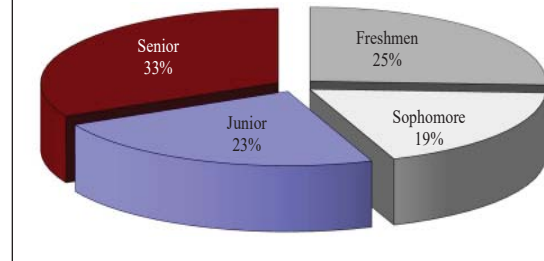

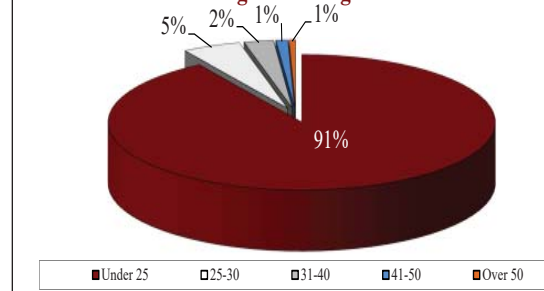
Fall 2016 Undergraduate Class Distribution



Age Distribution by Class

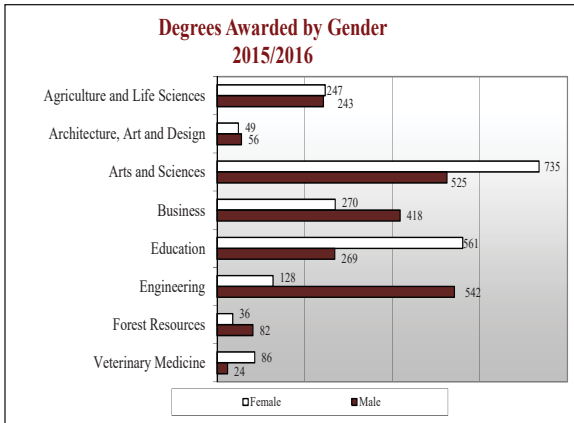

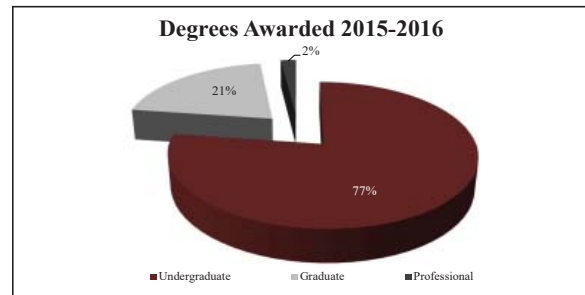

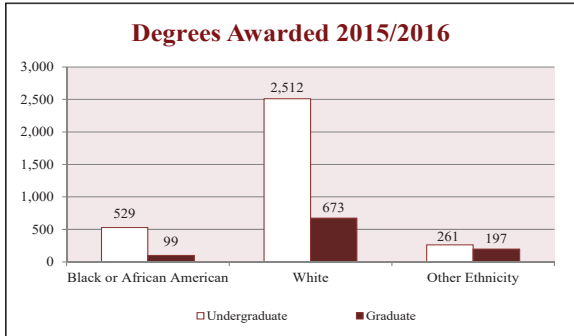

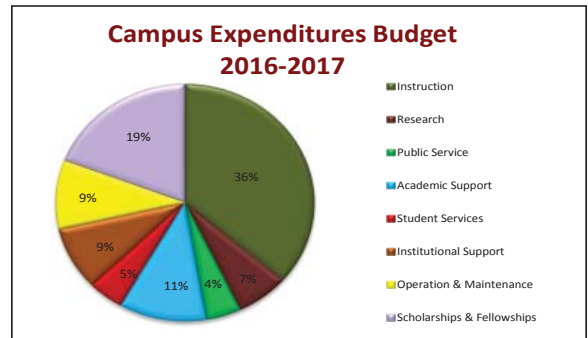
