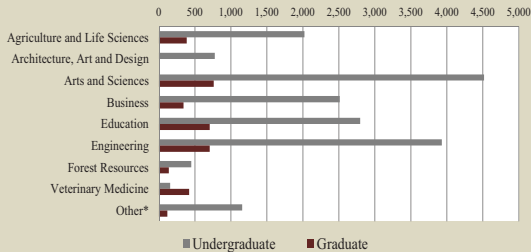

Adjacent States Enrollment Fall 2017



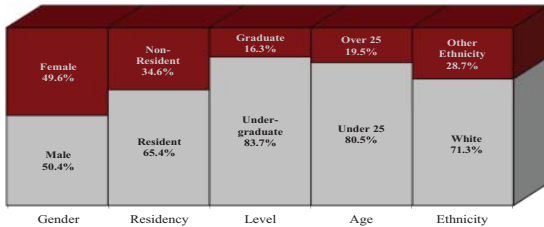

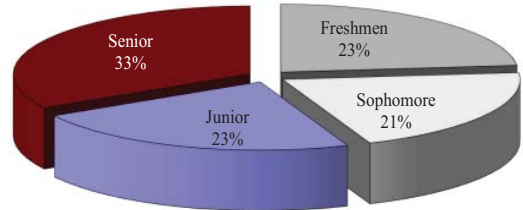

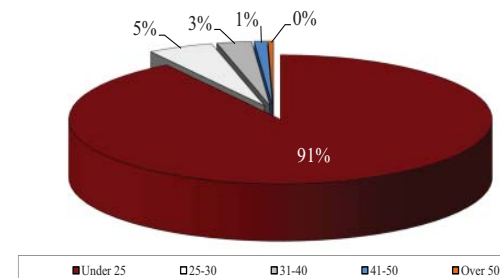
Fall 2017 Undergraduate Class Distribution



Age Distribution by Class

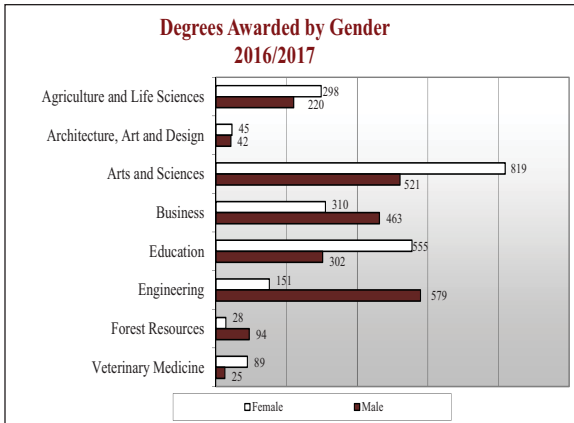

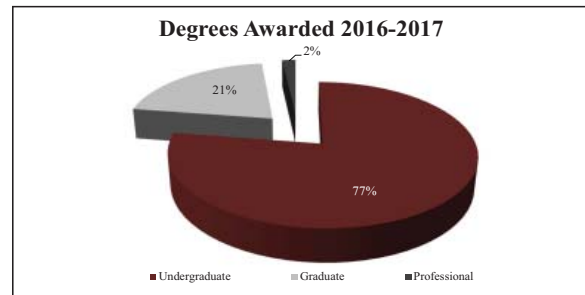

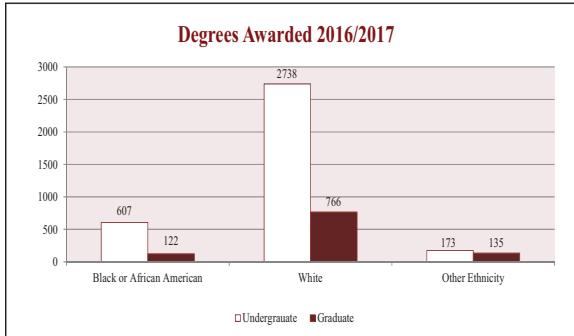
